RULES OF PROCEDURE

WHEREAS, §63 of New York State Town law provides that the Town Board may determine the rules of its procedures:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following "Rules of Procedure" for regular Town Board meetings be adopted.

The Town Supervisor, as Chairman of the Town Board, shall call meetings of the Town Board to order and shall be the Presiding Officer or Chair of the meeting, and as such shall officiate, maintain order and decorum, and permit public participation in an orderly manner and in accordance with the rules stated below.

1. **PLEDGE:** Call to order shall be followed by the pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

2. **ROLL CALL**: The Chair shall request Roll Call of the Town Board members by the Town Clerk, and after determining that a quorum exists, the Town Supervisor shall declare the meeting open. The Town Supervisor shall read the agenda (if not already published and distributed) and proceed to the business of the Town Board at hand.

3. **MINUTES:** At each meeting following the new Town Board's January Special Organizational Meeting, the Chair shall provide opportunity for the Town Board to review the minutes of the previous meeting of the Town Board. Thereafter, the Chair shall entertain a motion to approve the minutes as presented or to amend.

4. **CORRESPONDENCE:** The Chair shall first call for acknowledgment and summary of any petitions or written communications received by the Town Board. Copies shall be given to the Town Clerk for recording into the minutes.

5. **COMMITTEE REPORTS:** The Chair shall recognize committee chairmen for their committees report.

6. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:** The Public will be invited to comment as requested on items appearing in the published agenda, expressing any views, opinions, requests, recommendations or questions to the Board to address and/or take under advisement in its deliberations. A maximum time limit of 30 minutes. The Public is requested to be brief with their comments.

7. CONDUCT NEW BUSINESS

a. THE SUPERVISOR'S FISCAL REPORT shall be the first order of new business. It shall set forth public monies received through the Town clerk's Office and other sources, and the disbursement of public monies. The Chair shall entertain motions to approve the Supervisor's Fiscal Report and to approve all necessary disbursements of public monies through authorized fund accounts. All actions of the Town Board concerning the Supervisor's Fiscal Report shall be by motion.

b. RESOLUTIONS: For its deliberations on new matters of Town Business, the Board will work from the written agenda distributed to Board members in advance, posted on the Town bulletin board and distributed at Board meetings to public. Formal actions of the Town Board must be authorized by motion or resolution of the Town Board. No motion or resolution shall be brought to a vote unless it has been presented to all members of the Town Board at least 48 hours prior to the opening of the meeting and on the Town website. In emergency circumstances, however, all of the above requirements may be waived by a vote of a majority of the Town Board present, provided there is a quorum.

c. Every motion or resolution must be seconded before discussion of the Town Board or the Supervisor calls for a vote. All motions and resolutions shall be recorded in their entirety in the minutes of the Town Board meeting. As a member of the town Board, the Supervisor may offer or second motions and resolutions.

d. Town Board members must recuse themselves from participation in discussion or voting on matters that involve a conflict of interest and must place in the minutes their reasons for recusal. Abstention from a vote shall only be permitted for reasons of conflict of interest, and not for political considerations.

8. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:** The Board recognizes the value of public participation but reminds the Public that it is a privilege. Please address the Board with respect and civility.

9. **ADJOURNMENT:** Following resolutions, and open agenda period, the Town Board meeting shall be adjourned by motion, in memory of residents deceased.

IF THE ABOVE RULES OF PROCEDURE SHOULD AT ANY TIME BE IN CONFLICT WITH STATUTORY LAW, THEN STATUTORY LAW PREVAILS.

PROJECTS FUNDED BY THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF STORM RECOVERY OF THE NEW YORK STATE HOUSING TRUST FUND CORPORATION

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of Superstorm Sandy, the United States Congress, through Public Law passed the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act of 2013 (Public Law 113-2, approved January 29, 2013), as amended (the "Act"), appropriating \$16 billion, later reduced to \$15.18 billion, to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery ("CDBG-DR") funds for necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure, and housing and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from a major disaster declared due to Superstorm Sandy and other eligible events, including Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee, in calendar years 2011, 2012, and 2013 (the "Storms"), subject to the Federal statutes and regulations governing CDBG grants, as modified by exceptions and waivers previously granted and which may hereafter be granted by HUD; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the CDBG-DR Grant Program and Federal Register Notice (78 Fed. Reg. 14,329), published March 5, 2013, titled, "Allocations, Common Applications, and Alternative Requirements for Grantees Receiving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery Funds in Response to Hurricane Sandy (as amended)," the State has received an allocation of CDBG-DR funds from HUD in the amount of \$1,713,960,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the CDBG-DR Grant Program and Federal Register Notice (78 Fed. Reg. 69,104), entitled Second Allocation, Waivers, and Alternative Requirements for Grantees Receiving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery Funds in Response to Hurricane Sandy (as amended)," the State has received a second allocation of CDBG-DR funds from HUD in the amount of \$2,097,000,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the CDBG-DR Grant Program and Federal Register Notice (79 Fed. Reg. 62,183), entitled *Third Allocation, Waivers, and Alternative Requirements for Grantees Receiving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery Funds in Response to Hurricane Sandy* (as amended)," the State has received a third allocation of CDBG-DR funds from HUD in the amount of \$605,922,000 (of which \$185,000,000 has been allocated towards the proposals developed through the Rebuild by Design competition); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken has entered into a subrecipient agreement with the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery of the New York State Housing Trust Fund Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town of Shandaken Town Board, on behalf of the Town of Shandaken that the Town of Shandaken shall follow these policies and procedures in the procurement of goods and services necessary for the implementation of projects funded by the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery of the New York State Housing Trust Fund Corporation:

PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES

The Town of Shandaken will comply with the procurement standards required under 24 CFR 85.36 for all procurement activities utilizing CDBG-DR funds granted by the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery of the New York State Housing Trust Fund Corporation.

AVOIDING PROCUREMENT OF UNNECESSARY OR DUPLICATIVE ITEMS OR SERVICES

The director or supervisor of each department or agency of the Town of Shandaken responsible for procurement of services, supplies, equipment, or construction obtained with Federal, State or Local funds shall review all proposed procurement actions to avoid the purchase of unnecessary or duplicative items. Such reviews shall consider consolidation or breaking out to obtain a more economical purchase. When determined

appropriate by the director or supervisor, an analysis should be made of lease versus purchase alternatives and any other analysis to determine the most economical approach.

WHEREAS, Part 8 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations (24 CFR) requires adoption of grievance procedures to address complaints of those who feel they may have been discriminated against on the basis of disability and also requires the provision of notice of said grievance procedures, and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Town of Shandaken not to discriminate against any individual, person, or group on the basis of disability and the intent of the Town of Shandaken to address any complaints that may arise pursuant to Section 504, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Shandaken does hereby adopt by resolution internal grievance procedures (the "Procedure"), affixed to this resolution, providing for the prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services regulations implementing the Act, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Shandaken does hereby designate the Town Supervisor as the Grievance Coordinator who shall be responsible for receiving and addressing complaints pursuant to the Procedure adopted hereby and attached hereto, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Town of Shandaken will place its employees, the public, and potential beneficiaries of certain federal public programs on notice by undertaking certain actions that will include, but may not be limited to (1) providing a copy of the grievance procedure to its employees, (2) putting the public on notice by placing a notice in the Town of Shandaken's official newspaper, posting of notices in the Town of Shandaken's offices and facilities, placing notices in Town of Shandaken's publications, and/or distribution of memoranda or other written communications subsequent to adoption of this Procedure, (3) placing copies of the Procedure in the Shandaken Town Hall for review and dissemination, and (4) adding language to federal program brochures to insure all potential program beneficiaries are aware of the Town's adopted grievance procedures.

BACKGROUND: Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (the "Act") as amended prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in programs and activities conducted by HUD or that receive financial assistance from HUD. This includes the New York State Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program funded by HUD, administered by the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery (GOSR), and under which the Town of Shandaken has received financial assistance. The Act specifically provides that no qualified individual shall, solely by reason of his or her handicap, be excluded from program participation, including employment, be denied program benefits, or be subjected to discrimination. The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) established provisions for assuring equality of opportunity, full participation, independent living, and self-sufficiency of disabled persons relative to employment, benefits and services, accommodations, commercial facilities, and multi-family housing.

SECTION 504 POLICY/COMPLIANCE: Part 8 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations (24 CFR) requires the adoption and notice/publication of ADA grievance procedures for municipalities with 15 or more employees, Sections 8.53 and 8.54, respectively. Therefore, be it known that it is the policy of the Town of Shandaken not to discriminate on the basis of disability. Towards that end, the Town of Shandaken has adopted by resolution an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services regulations implementing the Act. The subject law and implementing regulations may be examined at Shandaken's Town Hall. The Town Supervisor for the Town of Shandaken has been designated to coordinate the efforts of the Town with respect to Section 504 compliance. This information can also be accessed on the Internet at the following address: http://portal.hud.gov/hudportal/HUD?src=/program_offices/fair_housing_equal_opp/disabilitie s/sect504. The Shandaken Town Hall is located at 7209 NY Route 28, Shandaken, New York. The Section 504 Coordinator can be reached at (845) 688-7165.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE: Any person who believes he or she has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of disability may file a grievance under the procedure adopted by the Town of Shandaken outlined below.

- Grievances must be submitted to the Section 504 Coordinator within 60 days of the date the person filing the grievance becomes aware of the alleged discriminatory action.
- A complaint must be in writing, containing the name and address of the person filing it. The complaint must state the problem or action alleged to be discriminatory and the remedy or relief sought.
- The Section 504 Coordinator (or her/his designee) shall conduct an investigation of the complaint. This investigation may be informal, but it must be thorough, affording all interested persons an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to the complaint. The Section 504 Coordinator will maintain the files and records of the Town of Shandaken relating to such grievances.
- The Section 504 Coordinator will issue a written decision on the grievance no later

than 30 days after its filing.

- The person filing the grievance may appeal the decision of the Section 504 Coordinator by writing to the Town Board of Shandaken within 15 days of receiving the Section 504 Coordinator's decision. The Board of Supervisors shall issue a written decision in response to the appeal no later than 30 days after its filing.
- The availability and use of this grievance procedure does not prevent a person from filing a complaint of discrimination on the basis of disability with the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights.

The Town of Shandaken will make appropriate arrangements to ensure that disabled persons are provided accommodations, if needed, to participate in this grievance process. Such arrangements may include, but are not limited to, providing interpreters for the deaf, providing taped cassettes of material for the blind, or assuring a barrier-free location for the proceedings. The Section 504 Coordinator will be responsible for such arrangements.

It is against the law for the Town of Shandaken to retaliate against anyone who files a grievance or cooperates in the investigation of a grievance.

e. Dogs who have been microchipped with active account, the fee for spayed/neutered shall \$6.00 plus \$1. Surcharge. The fee for unspayed/unneutered shall be \$12

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF LOCAL TRANSPORTATION FUNDING

WHEREAS, a reliable transportation infrastructure is vital for the safety of New York's travelling public and its economy; and

WHEREAS, 85 percent of New York's roads and bridges are maintained by local governments; and

WHEREAS, despite well-timed and targeted preventative maintenance treatments, the age and condition of many of our locally-owned transportation assets means that they are beyond preservation and in need of much more costly rehabilitation and reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, estimates by the State Comptroller, DOT and independent studies show a large portion of road mileage is deteriorating and many bridges in the state are rated structurally deficient and functionally obsolete; and

WHEREAS, the State Comptroller estimates that there will be \$89 billion in unmet local infrastructure needs over the next 20 years; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Association of Town Superintendents of Highways commissioned its own fifteen year analysis that indicates an annual funding gap of \$1.3 billion for the local system (excluding NYC) alone; and

WHEREAS, funding for our local system has been far short of what is needed and we've fallen further and further behind in maintaining the vast and aging transportation infrastructure over this long period with severe consequences for conditions ratings; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Consolidated Local Street and Highway Program (CHIPS) provides essential funding for every municipality in the state and is part of the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) capital program; and

WHEREAS, in the early 1990's the Governor and Legislature created the Dedicated Highway and Bridge Trust Fund (DHBTF) to pay for the NYSDOT capital program and the Dedicated

Mass Transit Trust Fund (DMTTF) to assist with the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) and other transit systems' capital programs; and

WHEREAS, when the DHBTF was created, it was agreed that the NYSDOT and MTA fiveyear capital programs would be similar in size and would be negotiated concurrently; and

WHEREAS, through 2005-09, both five-year capital programs were similar in size and adopted within months of each other; and

WHEREAS, in 2010 the Executive and Legislature broke traditional parity and enacted a fiveyear capital program for the MTA but not the DOT;
