

# Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity MONTH OF JUNE 2018

**FREESTYLE PARK:** There has been talk for many years of the Town incorporating either a skate park or a BMX park somewhere in the Town for the kids to enjoy. The idea has resurfaced again with a new enthusiasm and the idea has gained a lot of support in Pine Hill where the idea has been floated to turn the old Tennis Court into a Freestyle Park. Councilman VanBlarcum had reached out to several design companies for help in funding and design of such a park. Pillar Design has submitted a proposal to come up with two design plans and assistance in applying for a Tony Hawk Grant and other funding opportunities. A few fundraisers and the upcoming Bruce Storey Memorial Golf Tournament have raised funds available to perform this task. We have a resolution to move forward with the Scope of Work they are proposing.

**APPOINTMENTS:** We have several appointments due to vacancies and some returning employees.

First we'd like to welcome Howie McGowan as the new Municipal Code Officer filling the vacancy following Warren Tutt's departure. Howie comes to us with more than 30 years of construction experience and familiarity of the area. He will be working as a Full Time employee and we look forward to working with him in his role for the Town. Howie is well-versed in Construction he has not been trained in Flood Plain regulation. Until we can get him the proper training in this I will be performing the duties of Flood Plain Administrator, at no cost, and help Howie understand the rules as we move forward.

Following Kathy Jordan's resignation from the Planning Board the Town will be moving Sam Spata, who was our Primary Representative to the Ulster County Planning Board, to fill the term vacated which will expire in December of 2021. Replacing Mr. Spata at the County Planning Board will be Vivian Welton who was recently appointed as the Alternate. We wish them both well in their new capacities.

We are re-appointing Ricarda O'Connor as Marriage Officiant and Rayla Suzan-Hart and Mauela Jean-Pierre as Summer Recreation Director and Assistant Director respectively.

**SUMMER REC:** It's that time of year again as we gear up for another summer at the Belleayre Lake.

Camp will start on Tuesday, July 10<sup>th</sup> and run through Thursday, August 16<sup>th</sup>. There are two field trips planned the first on Wednesday, August 1<sup>st</sup> the kids will be taken to New York City to the Circle Line for Tours of the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. The second trip will be the annual summer end trip to Zoom Flume Water Park in Durham. We have resolutions tonight to advertise for bids for the trips, approve the contract with UCAT and approve the contract to use the Belleayre Beach. Of course we are looking for Counselors and Jr. Counselors to help with the camp. If you are interested please contact us or Rayla or Manny directly.

MISC.: We have a few other resolutions. One is to accept bids we placed last month for a Dump Body and a trailer for the Highway Department. We will not be awarding these tonight as Eric is at Highway Superintendent's Annual Conference and will need to review the bids for completeness. He will approve upon

his return. Eric asked me to inform you all that the Town's Annual Metal Pick up is slated for the week of June 17<sup>th</sup>. Residents are asked to have all METAL out by the road by Sunday the 17<sup>th</sup>. Once the crew passes your house they will not return.

There is also the annual resolution to approve the Public Assembly Permit for the Festival of the Voice. This year's event is slated for August  $3^{RD}-5^{TH}$  again in Phoenicia. This year's Main Production for Saturday night being the classic opera Carmen. As always we welcome the event and its guests and wish them continuing success for this year's event.

Also, it was brought to my attention earlier today by Councilwoman Storms that I had inadvertently left off two resolutions. We had reached out to several contractors and received singular bids for two necessary projects. One is regarding a \$4,000 estimate we received for necessary repairs for the Ambulance Personnel Housing in Phoenicia which will need some structural work by the front door. The second was for a \$1,700 repair for the front step of the Town Museum. We will have to do these as motions, so long as the rest of the Board is in agreement.

MEMORIAM: First, our condolences and prayers go out the families who lost their loved ones in a tragic accident on Oliverea Road. There is really nothing we can say or do to help you through this difficult time. I would like to again take the opportunity to thank all the local emergency responders who assisted on this call. At any given moment many of you are prepared and ready to walk upon any number of tragedies, and this by far was no exception. By all reports you were all professional and respectful to the families which does not go unnoticed. Special Thanks to Greg and Suzie Zaff for making the immediate call and allowing the responders use of their phone in order to maintain constant communications. The agencies that responded were numerous and out of fear of not recognizing someone, I will just add that all of you are and will continue with our sincerest gratitude.

With this in mind I wanted you all to recognize the commitment made by these men and women of our community, many of whom are merely volunteers. They made a commitment to provide these services for us and stand steadfast and ready to assist whenever possible. Such commitments should be a reminder of the effort that even the humblest of us can give that touches many lives. Our last resolution tonight respects that commitment and we hope will give residents and visitors time to reflect on the commitments made by volunteers and professionals alike. We are requesting the newly constructed bridge on NYS Rte 28 in Big Indian be dedicated in the name of recently deceased Big Indian - Oliverea Fire Chief Jody Rossitz. We along with several members of the immediate community feel this a small but fitting tribute to a gentleman who was, by all who knew him, a "Fireman's Fireman." A man who knew what his duty was and was prepared to do his best to assist anyone when called upon. We are making this request for support of this action to State Senator Seward and Assemblyman Cahill who have already graciously agreed to help bring this forward.

#### TO HONOR FALLEN FIRE CHIEF JOHN "JODY" ROSSITZ

SUPPORT DEDICATION OF NYS ROUTE 28 BRIDGE IN BIG INDIAN

**WHEREAS**, in March of 2018 the Town of Shandaken was saddened to hear of the unexpected loss of long-standing Fire Chief John "Jody" Rossitz; and

WHEREAS, the Town and immediate community have noted Chief Rossitz's commitment to his community through volunteerism and his life-long devotion to volunteer firefighting; and

WHEREAS, being that such dedication to community and volunteerism is becoming more rare with each passing day and the Town and community do not wish that dedication to be forgotten or lost to future generations; and

**WHEREAS,** New York State is currently replacing the NYS Route 28 bridge over the Esopus in the vicinity of the Big Indian-Oliverea Fire House; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town wishes to have the bridge dedicated in Chief Rossitz's name.
