SUPERVISOR'S NOTES - JULY 2023

This month we have received a \$165,000. grant to do stream engineering on McKinley Hollow rd. that washes out frequently from over-banking the stream.

Speaking of stream work, SLR did extensive engineering on a Bonnieview ave. bridge which is a large culvert, being just under 20' We are trying to have that replaced this year and through the LFA, local flood analysis, we can fund most of it through grants.

All this work has been the efforts from our flood resilience committee SAFARI- thank you.

The SLR engineers are still working on a 'letter of map revision' (LOMR) for Mt. Tremper. After the new bridge was installed, DOT seemed to misplace the elevations and survey data and we have recently obtained it. This LOMR will give new elevations for the base- flood elevations BFE, near and around the new bridge and help nearby home-owners lower their flood insurance.

We are working on a grant for the Comprehensive Plan update. There are a couple of routes available to explore.

In the works still is the Pine Hill parking lot and the storm-water remediation we need to engineer prior to re-surfacing, that will be paid for by a grant from CWC/ DEP as can any storm-water systems down Main st. putting together a committee to discuss water/ run-off affluent retention/ We also received a grant of \$5,400. for a fresh food scrap collection and composting program from the Lindsay and Olive B. O'Connor Foundation, a big shout-out thank you to them!

The Ambulance has been busy this past month not only responding to calls for service, but also participating in great events in Town like our Independence Day parade this past weekend, and the first annual Touch a Truck Bazaar held after the parade. Many thanks to the organizers of these great events- especially Heather Craig who is likely still searching for her sanity. Hopefully the newly established Touch A Truck event will continue as many kids (and even adults) had a great time looking at all of the great equipment from around the area!

In light of this past month's kerfuffle, the only time that official correspondence on behalf of the Town of Shandaken Ambulance Service will be released is when it is issued and/or approved by the Chief staff of the Town of Shandaken Ambulance. There are two designated Public Information Officers (PIOs) for the Ambulance-Chief Richard Muellerleile, or Deputy Chief Michael Williams. No one else is approved to make official statements pertaining to the operations of the Ambulance Service. The only exception is during emergencies- a PIO may be designated by the Chief Staff if they are attending to other matters, however any official correspondence on behalf of the Ambulance Service will be vetted and signed off by one of the PIOs. This is in accordance to our Administrative and Operational Chain of Command.

And while we're on the riveting subject of administrative stuff, protected health information (PHI) is a confidential medical record pertaining to an individual who received care from the Ambulance Service. It is unlawful for anyone to access or request this information following care unless directly requested by the patient or their guardian/parent/attorney for lawful purposes. This information is protected by law in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPPA) which created a series of standards to protect sensitive patient health information from being disclosed without patient consent or knowledge. Our responders receive training in this- and request that everyone be respectful of this law- as it is a crime to disclose any of this information. That means if you see an ambulance at your neighbors, don't rush out and ask our responders what happened- aside from being extremely tacky, you'll likely be told it was a shark attack.

Shandaken Historical Museum Report for June 2023

We've had 36 visitors, and 50+ visiting Nor'Easters this month.

We've done searches via email for Calvin Walters, Scott Schaffer, Robert Gurbo, and Drew Mackay. I've been requested to work with April Beisaw and Cyntia Nikitin out of Boiceville, in regards to the "Brunel" Native American statues and display there, we're hoping to collaborate on a project or two. History searchers in Boiceville have reached out to us numerous times lately.

Enthusiasm for local history is growing. Also our friend and author Cesi Davidson has been researching slavery in Shandaken here at the museum and gave a talk and presentation at the Interpretive Center.

The metal detection event was a great success. They found historic coins, jewelry, household items like utensils & locks, a police whistle and many unique bits of history. I'm grateful to the Peekamoose, the Full Moon Resort and Phoenicia's Pizza 28 for donations of food for our big Saturday night dinner in Big Indian Park. We received a large donation for our museum and we look forward to having them back next year.

Many people have brought in donations this month. We received two family Bibles , one from Ellen Johnson she also donated Crystal Spring Water & soda bottles as well as some photos. The other family bible was donated by Sonia Ellsworth Natoli , she also had photos and an original Belleayre brochure , she even had a map of ski trails in Pine Hill from before Belleayre opened. We also received a framed postcard display of the Grand Hotel. Most recently a box of postcards, greeting cards, and general mail from Emma Cummings of Pine Hill postmarks are from the 20's, found by the current owners the Shilling family.

We were blessed by our Shandaken friends Teresa Grant, Joyce Grant, Grant Cure, Barbara Lumbaca, Charlene Kallivrousis, Bob Kalb and Mr. & Mrs. Hermann when they very generously organized a clean-up party for our overgrown flower beds, Thank you all.

I've been told that Vinnie Sorbellini will be here to install the hot water heater on 7/17 - 7/19. Having hot water will be wonderful.
