The first month of the year came and went like a whirlwind, and left in its path our busiest Month for calls in the Ambulance Service's existence. 31 calls for service alone were to the ski center, and many calls for service happened during the weekend. Also, several of those calls happened back to back- exhausting our crews and resources available. Thank you to our mutual aid partner Margaretville Hospital EMS, who handled one call in Shandaken during the Month, and were dispatched several more times and cancelled as backup crews were able to assemble to handle the additional call for service.

A huge shout out to the Ski Patrol, and also to our weekend and backup crews that tirelessly answer call after call during these downright crazy weekends. These thanks are also extended to our Fire Departments who assist in some very critical calls that require landing zones, and our medical partner in the sky, Lifenet NY, who enable transport of the critically injured to NYS designated trauma centers- as there are no adult or pediatric trauma centers within an hours driving distance from Highmount.

COVID UPDATE- As of 1/2/23 total active cases in the Town have dropped to 0. Cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 406, with 405 recovered. There is still one fatality accounted for in the Town. There are 147 active cases of COVID in Ulster County at this time, with cumulative cases in the County reaching 54,847. There are a total of 414 cumulative fatalities since the beginning of the Pandemic in the County, and a total of 54,286 individuals recovered.

On the morning of February 3rd, over a thousand residents of Shandaken, New York woke up without electricity, without internet, and without cell service as outside temperatures went as low as -11°F. Through the hard work of NYSEG, Spectrum, our fire departments, and the town's many good neighbors, crisis was largely averted - to say nothing of the plumbers, HVAC technicians, and handy people who helped repair, replace, and patch as needed - but every winter day is a reminder of just how precarious the situation can be here in the mountains.

To give context: the median age in Shandaken is nearly 60 years old. The closest hospital is 30 minutes away. The area is flood prone, our school district crosses 3 townships and can take nearly an hour to drive across, and our roads are packed with guests and visitors who are often unfamiliar with our weather, their neighbors, or with local contractors & services. Even emergency radio is sometimes inconsistent or unavailable.

In short - the lack of cell service in Shandaken is a catastrophe waiting to happen.

Whether it be to help our most at risk populations, or to improve Catskills tourism, or simply to avoid tragedy for our emergency services - it is vital that communications be improved in our area. The town of Shandaken has made efforts but they simply haven't been enough. Please consider this letter a request for assistance, support, and direction in bringing better service to Shandaken.

#### Shandaken Historical Museum Report for January 2023

With 41 visitors there are also people I have helped with research....I heard the Pine Hill Wellington group got their historic grant, and is now on the National register of Historic landmark buildings, that's great. The museum was happy to provide much needed history and the Pine Hill Wellington Group will improve Pine Hill greatly with this project. Diane Galusha was also here I helped her find some information on slavery in the Catskills for her latest project.

I've been in touch with Johanna Byron from the Shandaken Reformed Church in Mt.Tremper founded in 1852. They recently closed their doors for good. The congregation voted to donate several items to our museum such as silver candle holders, a communion set, a pewter challis\vase, the cloth Bible marker with the donation plaque – donated by the Shlegel family and the communion outfit which holds all the tiny wine glasses, and a few Hymnals. It is an amazing collection we were lucky to acquire for Shandaken history. Another donation came from a senior at Onteora High School. He brought us a "Big Chief Much Pure" Spring Water bottle, bottled in Shandaken, N.Y. and an Osterhoudt grocery pad of receipts as well as a fossil he found at the Esopus Creek with shells and a starfish on it. Thank you, Liam Bertheaud.

Vinnie Sorbellini has yet to come back all though he said he'd be here next week a few times. Thank God for my Swiffer Wet Jet. We still need repairs done that were approved last year.

I've been contacted by our metal detecting friends the Nor'Easters, our event will be at the end of June this year so we will be reaching out to our historic property owners looking for participants. #### Town of Shandaken Local Law No. 1 of 2023 Amending Chapter 107 of the Code of the Town of Shandaken to Add a Tax Exemption for Volunteer Firefighters

#### Sec.1 Title

This Local Law shall be known as "Local Law No.1 of 2023: Amending Chapter 107 of the Code of the Town of Shandaken to add a tax exemption for Volunteer Firefighters.

#### Sec. 2 Purpose and Findings

It is the purpose of this Local Law to implement the authority granted to local taxing jurisdictions by The Real Property Tax Law, to make available a tax exemption for volunteer firefighters at the option of the local municipality. The Town Board further finds and determines that the Town of Shandaken should exercise said option and implement said tax exemption because it would acknowledge the valuable services rendered by our volunteer firefighters and would enhance the ability to recruit and retain new volunteers serving the residents of the Town of Shandaken.

#### Sec. 3 Grant of Property Tax Exemption for Volunteer Firefighters

Chapter 107 of the Town Code, "Taxation" shall be amended by adding "Article VI - Tax Exemption for Volunteer Firefighters as follows:

Article VI. Tax Exemption for Volunteer Firefighters

§ 107-12 Legislative Intent

The Real Property Tax Law has been amended to allow a town to grant a partial tax exemption on real property owned by an enrolled active member of an incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department or such member and spouse. Said partial exemption is 10% of the assessed value of such property for all town and special district purposes, exclusive of special assessments.

#### § 107-13 Grant of exemption

The Town of Shandaken authorizes an exemption of 10% of assessed value of property owned by such enrolled active members as set forth below or such enrolled member and spouse. Said exemption applies to taxation with respect to town and special district purposes, exclusive of special assessments.

#### § 107-14 Eligibility.

Upon application, such exemption shall be granted to an enrolled active member of an incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department provided that:

- A. The applicant resides in the Town of Shandaken and the Town of Shandaken is served by such incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department in which the applicant is an enrolled member;
- B. The property is the primary residence of the applicant;
- C. The property is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided, however, that in the event any portion of such property is not used exclusively for the applicant's residence but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section; and
- D. The applicant has been certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department as an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department for at least 2 years.

§ 107-15 Grant of lifetime exemption.

Any enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department or who accrues more than 20 years of active service and is so certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department shall be granted the 10% exemption as authorized by this article for the remainder of his or her life as long as his or her primary residence is located within the Town of Shandaken, New York.

§ 107-16 Application.

Application for such exemption shall be filed with the Town Assessor on or before the taxable status date on a form as prescribed by the Commissioner of Tax and Finance.

§ 107-17 No diminution of benefits.

No applicant who is a volunteer firefighter who by reason of such status is receiving any benefit under the provisions of Article 4 of the Real Property Tax Law on the effective date of this article shall suffer any diminution of such benefit because of the provisions of this article.

§ 107-18 Certification.

Each incorporated volunteer fire company or incorporated volunteer fire department shall file a notice annually, prior to the applicable taxable status date, with the Town Assessor certifying its then currently enrolled members with 2 or more years of service. Such notice shall list as of the applicable taxable status date the number of years of service served by each such enrolled member and such enrolled member's address of residence.

§ 107-19 Repeal, Amendment and Supersession of Other Laws

All other Ordinances or Local Laws of the Town of Shandaken which are in conflict with the provisions of this Local Law are hereby superseded or repealed to the extent necessary to give this Local Law force and effect during its effective period.

§ 107-20 Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.








# **NYSDOT Hydraulic Design Criteria for Bridges**

FREEBOARD MEASURED FROM LOW CHORD TO WATER SURFACE

- The proposed low chord shall not be lower than the existing low chord.
- No increase in water surface elevations compared to the existing conditions for both the 50- and 100-Year flows.
- Increase estimated flood flows to account for climate change
- Minimum of 2.0 feet of freeboard for the projected 50-Year flood.
- The projected 100-Year flow shall pass below the proposed low chord without touching it.





