## **Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity**

## Month of July 2014

**Special Thanks:** Just a brief note of thanks to all of you who reached out to myself and my family following the loss of my Mother in May. Your words of support and encouragement from across the community and region meant a lot to us during a difficult time. My entire family and I are eternally grateful.

NYSEG: A representative from NYSEG recently visited the Town of Shandaken Complexes throughout the Town to perform and energy audit on all of our lighting fixtures. Through their Small Business Efficiency Program we are eligible for several upgrades that reportedly will accrue us large savings over the coming years. We have received the information on all buildings excepting the Town Hall at this time. At this time the total of all jobs to be performed would be \$14,684.63. NYSEG will offset that cost by paying \$8,322.52. The Town for a cost of \$6,362.11 would see a savings of \$7,889.75 annually. So as far as the Town is concerned we would recoup our costs within the 2015 Fiscal Year. Anticipating additional costs for the Town Hall at roughly \$2,000 I am requesting that we release the amount from our Good Neighbor Funds (current balance of \$382,431.16) not to exceed \$8,500 for upgrades to Town Municipal Buildings Lighting Equipment. We have a resolution tonight to approve these expenditures from that account.

**Summer Rec:** The Town's Summer Recreation Program kicks off tomorrow and runs for the next six weeks. This year we are sending the kids to the Ulster County Fair and Zoom Flume water park. We have the resolutions to reappoint Rayla and Manny as Director and Assistant Director respectively as well as a new position of Senior Counselors for two individuals who have been employed with the program for five years or more. We have a number of new counselors and look forward to seeing the kids enjoy themselves and expand their horizons with the multiple arts and nature projects the Directors have created for this year.

**Insurance:** The Town Insurance rates are increasing. As such, I've asked our agent to investigate costs for a short-term policy to carry us into January of 2015. This would save us some funds in this year's budget, if cost effective, and allow us to do our renewal in January as it used to be. This simplifies a few things and may give us some time to investigate other options with other carriers to try and reduce some the costs before the start of the New Year. Having written this earlier today, I do not have hard costs on the short-term request, yet.

**Miscellaneous:** The Town Planning Board has sent us a letter stating that they would like to hire McCabe & Mack from Poughkeepsie as their attorney to assist them in matters of the Belleayre Resort review. They will be charging \$200/hr which is in line with what we pay most of our other municipal attorneys. The Town Board resolution tonight supports their selection.

Eric is in need of an employee in the Highway Department. He's especially looking for someone with a strong background in Diesel Mechanic work. Anyone interested should contact the Highway Department at 688-5031.

Some of you may have been notified already, but the US Postal Service has notified residents that they are looking for input as to what to do with the Highmount and Big Indian Post Offices. They have contacted my office and we are scheduling a combined meeting here prior to our next month's Town Board meeting. We have a resolution tonight to set up that meeting. So anyone interested in this issue please be in attendance at 6pm here at the Town Hall on Monday, August 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Signs and Kiosks:** Eric and the Highway Department have started placing the posts around town and the new Welcome signs will be up shortly. We are also coordinating the construction of the first Information Kiosk for the Town to be located in Big Indian Park. We are looking for volunteers to assist us this weekend starting at 9am in Big Indian Park. We are asking for anyone with a carpentry background and tools to assist in the construct. The Town, upon completion of the Kiosk, place a placard on the Kiosk in recognition of your service to our community. Anyone interested in helping, please call the supervisor's office for details at 688-7165.

**Events:** We have several worthwhile events going on throughout the Town this month including the Art Studio Tour, Big Indian Pow-Wow, Belleayre Concert Series and, of course, the Fifth International Festival of the Voice, as well as Pancake Breakfasts and Spaghetti Dinners and Chicken BBQs. Some of the folks representing these events are here tonight and can elaborate on each of their offerings. We wish them all the best of luck and we

will be posting all these events on the Town website (Shandaken.us) and Facebook page as they arise.

Police: Lastly, tonight we have a resolution to hire a new Part-Time Police Chief. The Town Board met with the Police Commissioners last Wednesday to conduct interviews of the candidates. We had nine applications and four Officers were interviewed. The Boards were impressed with each of these gentlemen, as each interviewed extremely well and made the decision more difficult than we thought it would be. In the end the Board has placed a resolution to hire Chad Storey from Shandaken to be the next Part-Time Chief. Chad is a local Officer who has accrued exceptional qualifications and comes with not only an extensive personal knowledge of the area and the people, but who has proven himself exemplary in both of his positions as a Part-Time Officer with the Town of Shandaken and also as a K-9 Officer, then a Detective with the Family Crimes unit and now as a Sergeant with the Ulster County Sheriff's Department. We all wish him well in this endeavor.

Of course, these are some big shoes to fill. The Town Board would like to take this opportunity to recognize the man retiring from this position. W. James McGrath. Jim, as most of us know him, has proven himself time and again within this position as well as a lengthy history working for the Town and County as an Officer over his many years of service. Whether it be domestic disputes, drug busts, burglaries or shootings, both accidental and intentional, he has seen his share of some of the best and worst Shandaken has offered up over his many years. Jim has always worked diligently to keep everything in perspective and dealing with citizens from an even keel. Personally, I knew Jim from the Ski shop at Belleayre, and some early juvenile activities, but never knew to what extent he would become one of my closest friends. I can tell you all that I would have had a much more difficult time dealing with many of the issues we have faced over the years and especially during Irene had he not been there to offer advice or support. Jim the Town of Shandaken thanks you for your years of service and would like you step forward so we may present you a plaque recognizing your efforts with the Town.
