## Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity MONTH OF AUGUST 2019

Rentals throughout the Town following the compilation of survey data, the Town is appointing a formal Short Term Rental Committee. We are hoping that this group comprised of one member from the Town, Planning and Zoning Boards, the Code Officer, two members from the Shandaken Homesharing Association (as recommended by the previous committee and the Homesharing Association), two owners of lodging establishments and a general resident, will work out some type of regulatory process or procedure that will meet the desires of the community while still sanctioning the activity to continue. The committee members will have to figure on a schedule for meetings which we hope will continue at regular intervals; at least

MTC: We have a resolution tonight to enter into agreement with Margaretville Telephone Company to allow them an easement for a small outbuilding on the Glenbrook Park property. Previously we had agreed to terms to allow them to run fiber optic cable feeding the cell tower. This building will house emergency backup equipment to ensure continued operation of their systems. In addition, the Town negotiated and MTC agrees to provide an emergency back-up generator for the Police/Ambulance building located near the proposed structure. They will install and maintain this equipment as long as their own equipment and the structure remain. This helps us in providing continuity of our emergency services even during times of disaster.

**Shandaken Septic District:** Following last month's meeting and rather serendipitously, the Town was contacted by a responsible party regarding the parcel that we were moving to take for the Septic Maintenance District in Shandaken. We are currently in negotiations with the current landowner and hope to bring this issue to resolve without moving on any eminent domain proceedings. We will update you as those negotiations once they are concluded. That portion of the project only affects 4 of the 57 parcels included in the district. In an effort to move the project forward, the Town will Phase the Project so as not to delay the repairs or replacements for the majority of other parcels in the District. Tonight we have a resolution to advertise for bids for the work to be completed under this phase of the project. We hope to receive bids by our next meeting scheduled for September 9<sup>th</sup>. Upon awarding the Project could then move to construction this fall as long as weather permits.

MISC.: Due to clerical workloads increasing in several departments in Town, we recognize a need for assistance in the offices. We were made aware of a program offered through Youth Advocacy Programs, Inc. operating

an office in Kingston, where they can provide us young adult seeking training in certain fields at no cost to the Town while they provide them with a salary. It provides the youth with skills in order to find employment in a field they are interested, pays them and provides us with a set of hands to assist us in meeting our needs. This is a win all the way around and especially for the Town taxpayers who will not need to foot the bill.

We also have been presented with a petition on behalf of the Phoenicia Library requesting that they be placed on the ballot for this fall's election. They are requesting an additional \$10,000 be added to their annual tax encumbrance bringing the total tax from \$162,000 to \$172,000 dollars. The Town Clerk has already certified the petition and the Town Board is required to make a resolution to place it on this November's ballot.

**GRANTS:** The Consolidated Funding Applications (grants) were due Friday, July 26<sup>th</sup>. I would like thank Candace Balmer, from RCAP Solutions and Engineer George Caughman from Milone & MacBroom, Inc. for helping to get the Phoenicia Water District application together which was no small task considering we are asking for the full \$750,000 available. We worked down to the wire submitting our application near the deadline. Now we will have to await word which usually occurs in mid-December to January. Fingers crossed.

EVENTS: Congratulations to the organizers of this past weekend's events. A big Thank you to Maria Todaro, Louis Otey, Barbara Kolb and the countless volunteers who pulled off the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Festival of the Voice. Aside from a short shower which cancelled a performance on Saturday afternoon, the event was again a success on many levels especially for bringing this kind of cultural experience to our residents and visitors. For those of you who may have been in Phoenicia, many of you are missing out on a wonderful free concert series taking place on Sunday evenings in Big Indian Park at the June LaMarca Pavilion, a very relaxing way to close out the weekend. Thanks to the Big Indian Beautification Committee for sponsoring these events. There are 2 more events planned for the coming month check the Town Website for dates and times.

There are plenty of other events to close out our summer this month, but most important is the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Shandaken Day slated for Saturday, August 17<sup>th</sup> from 10am to 5pm at the Maurice Hinchey Catskill Visitor's Center in Mt. Tremper. This year we kick things off with a Color Run starting at 9am to benefit Shandaken PBA. Entry fee is \$20 per runner OR \$10 if you bring either an unwrapped toy for a child school age K-5<sup>th</sup> grade, 2 hygiene or 3 non-perishable food items. Call the Town Clerk's Office for more details. We will also be hosting a Cornhole Tournament to benefit our Emergency Services and Not-For-Profit Organizations, sponsored by ICS Custom Design, Inc. We also are looking forward a new attraction; a human hamster wheel for make your own snow cones! We have a spot to make your own tie-dyes T-shirts, food vendors including fresh BBQ, beer supplied by Woodstock Brewery, live music from Wyld Blu and all the kids' games including the ever popular watermelon eating contest. It's a wonderful location and a good time for the family and it's FREE.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 9, 2019 at 7:00 pm.

# RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF SHANDAKEN AUTHORIZING THE SHANDAKEN SEWER MAINTENANCE DISTRICT TO SOLICIT BIDS

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken ("Town Board") previously entered into an agreement with the Catskill Watershed Corporation ("CWC") to participate in the Community Wastewater Management Program ("Program"), which provides for the planning, design and construction of community septic systems and/or the creation of septic maintenance districts in the NYC Watershed West of the Hudson River; and

**WHEREAS,** CWC's consultant for the Program, Lamont Engineers, has prepared a Preliminary Engineer's Report for the Hamlet of Shandaken in the Town of Shandaken, evaluating various alternative methods for managing the wastewater needs of the hamlet; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken, by resolution passed May 6, 2019, established the Shandaken Sewer Maintenance District ("District") to be funded through a block grant administered by CWC under the Program; and

**WHEREAS,** the District wishes to move forward and solicit bids to retain the services of contractors to commence the repair, replacement and maintenance of on-site septic systems within the District to serve the residents within the Hamlet of Shandaken in accordance with design plans prepared by CWC's consultant under the Program.

#### THEREFORE, NOW BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Town Board of the Town of Shandaken authorizes the Town Supervisor to solicit bids from and review the qualifications of contractors able and willing to perform the repair, replacement and maintenance of on-site septic systems to serve the residents within the Hamlet of Shandaken.
