It seems that now more than ever our roads are becoming more congested as the weather becomes pleasant, and EVERYONE has a terrible case of cabin fever. Historically we see an increase in auto accidents starting every April and lasting through summer. This year has been no exception. Whether it is a minor fender bender, or a serious accident it will certainly ruin your day, and quite possibly someone else's. PLEASE stay attentive while driving. As much as it may be difficult with the scenery, and as much as you want to shuffle your tunes on your phone (since you can't talk on it), keep your eyes on the road and drive with regard for others.

Speaking of driving, tonight we open bids for a new ambulance to replace an aging vehicle that has served our Town extremely well. Ambulances are not cheap, and rest assured that the committee involved in specifying the new ambulance have painstakingly held the line with unnecessary expenditures. As lives literally depend on the reliability and functionality of our fleet, emphases on length of service, safety, and warranty have been the focus of the specifications outlined. Hopefully a bidder will fulfill all of those points without exception. It is expected that this ambulance will serve the Town for the next ten plus years.

COVID UPDATE- As of 6/4, there were 44 active cases of COVID in Ulster County- an all time low since the start of the pandemic. There are no cases in the Town of Shandaken at this time, and only 10 out of the 21 Townships in Ulster County can currently say that. Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 113, with all recovered. To date we still have had no fatalities, and yet again we are one of only five Towns in Ulster County that have been that fortunate (Denning, Hardenburg, Olive, Shandaken, and Town of Kingston). Total cumulative cases in the County have reached 15,174, with a total of 263 fatalities. 14,867 cases have successfully recovered.

All of that said, Keep doing what you're doing and stay strong Shandaken! As Governor Cuomo adopted the CDC guidance on mask use and social distancing for fully vaccinated individuals in May, and over 52% of New Yorkers are vaccinated, you may see many welcomed smiles around your hamlet this summer. Understand however, that business operators and building owners may require all individuals to wear a face covering, and may deny admittance to those that do not comply*. Just be sure to look for conspicuously posted signs on our businesses requiring masks, and respect their established rules. Its as simple as that!

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING INCREASE of CAPITAL FUNDING for BELLEAYRE MOUNTAIN from the OLYMPIC REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Belleayre Mountain Ski Center and Beach (BELLEAYRE) are located wholly within the Town of Shandaken, Ulster County, NY; and

WHEREAS, BELLAYRE was established through NYS Constitutional Amendment for the purpose of Economic Development and has been the lynch pin of the region for almost 75 years. BELLEAYRE is not only a lifeline of our economy; it sustains the cultural and community identities here and everyone who lives and works in this region relies on its success either directly or indirectly; and

WHEREAS, currently operations of **BELLEAYRE** fall under the auspices of the Olympic Regional Development Authority (**ORDA**) in Lake Placid, NY, which operates 3 Alpine Ski Facilities (**BELLEAYRE**, Gore and Whiteface Mtns.) as well as a number of other Olympic Venues in and around Lake Placid.

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken Town Board understands there are needs to be met at other facilities and especially in Lake Placid prior to the 2023 University Games and the need for infrastructure improvements at many of these locations and the \$103 million + Capital Funding from New York State for **ORDA** is a step in the right direction, we question the allocation within **ORDA** to its facilities, specifically **BELLEAYRE**; and

WHEREAS, a recent article in the Mid-Hudson News defined plans for next year at BELLEAYRE as follows: "A total of \$2 million would be applied toward upgrades to snowmaking equipment, \$1 million for facility improvements and \$125,000 for expanded summer programming." If accurate, this approximate \$3 million investment represents 2.3% of the overall allocation to ORDA in the 21-22 budget; and

WHEREAS, BELLEAYRE's future determines our future and right now, it seems that the economic outlook for both Belleayre and the region are being compromised.

THEREFORE, Be It Resolved the Town of Shandaken Town Board formally request the following:

- New York State to investigate the allocations proposed within **ORDA**.
- **ORDA** to explain the reasoning behind the allocation disparity and be held accountable for not maintaining communication with the local communities where they operate, especially **BELLEAYRE**
- **ORDA** work toward opening lines of communication with local communities to look into co-beneficial projects (Mountain Biking, Rail-Trail, etc).
