Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity

Month of August 2014

Shandaken Day: I'd like to thank everyone that made this year's event in Big Indian another success. I would be remiss if I did not give a huge Thank you to Tina, Willie and Danny Rice for all the hard work and personal time they committed to help make the event a success year after year. The day started a little damp but cleared up as the day progressed. If you did not make it to the event, we had our usual kid's games and Live Music provided by the band Wyld Blu, who were fantastic to work with. Special thanks to Evan Pritchett and MaryLou Stapleton for bringing along some friends and enlightening our hearts and minds with Native American songs and tributes throughout the morning. One of the biggest highlights of the day had to be the unveiling of our first Official Town of Shandaken Information Kiosk. The Kiosk was constructed with help from the Shandaken Highway Departement, Hugh Hurst, John and Jay Michelotti, Brian Perez, Brian Grant, Bill McDowell, Mike Wentland, Robert Kalb, Gary Gailes and the Big Indian Market. Dave Channon did the artwork on the panels which were vetted over several meetings of the Kiosk committee. Please take a moment to stop up at Big Indian Park and check out this new resource which we hope will help inform visitors and locals on everything we have to offer here in Shandaken. We still have some finishing touches, but for all intents and purposes, this kiosk is complete. Our next one will be placed on Main St., Pine Hill over the next few weeks. The Kiosk is paid for through a Smart Growth Grant provided through the NYS DEC. We have a resolution tonight to allow us a one year extension on the grant which allows us to continue getting reimbursed for these costs until we complete all the Kiosks.

New this year we also partnered with our friends at the Central CATSKILL Chamber of Commerce in Margaretville and created the Getaway-Giveaway, which was a huge success. From data provided on the raffle tickets we are now able to create a database of attendees in order to send out notifications for future regional events such as Shandaken Day. The prizes were fantastic and thanks to the many local business that donated something to our event.

On a final note, for years we have moved Shandaken Day around the Town to educate people on the vastness of our Township and provide every community a chance to host the

event. Myself and other organizers over the years can attest which have been our most successful event locations, and by far, Big Indian Park is the best location for everyone involved including the vendors we try to attract each year. We are mulling over the idea of landing the event permanently in Big Indian, but still staying true to circulating the hamlets to be recognized each year. We think this will be beneficial long-term for the event and simplify many aspects of the event. Please talk to any of the Town Board members and let us know your opinion.

Employees: The Town has several resolutions concerning employment with the Town. Sadly, my confidential secretary had to leave for personal reasons and I am now in need of a full-time secretary in the office. The position pays \$10.55/hr for 35 hours per week and eligible for benefits after three months. I hope to fill this position as soon as possible.

Police Chief Storey and the Commissioners conducted interviews last week and have selected four officers to join us on a Part-Time basis. We also are welcoming back an old friend to help us as Former Chief McGrath will be appointed tonight to join the Police Commissioner's Board, so welcome back, Jim.

The Ambulance Department is hiring another driver, Alicia Schnack of Big Indian, to assist the department.

Lastly, due to my mother's passing, we had an opening as Glenbrook Park Manager and Kathy Williams will be appointed tonight to fill out the remainder of her term which expires in December of 2016.

Campaign signage: We have our annual memorializing resolution asking residents to not place any campaign signage out until after the Columbus Day Weekend. Of course, there is a primary taking place tomorrow, so we hope that those signs are removed Wednesday following that special vote.

Zoning Change: The Town is looking at zoning along Main St. in Pine Hill. The entire south side of Main Street is zoned Hamlet Commercial while on the North side only a few parcels by Elm St. are zoned Commercial with the majority of parcels Hamlet Residential. The proposal, as supported through recommendation of the Town Planning Board is to rezone the entire north side of Main St. from Maple Ave. Extension to Academy St. as Hamlet Commercial as well. This only makes sense considering that many of the structures on the north side of the street were used historically as commercial and have retained their historic commercial aesthetic. We are planning a public hearing on this matter to be held just prior to next month's regularly scheduled Board meeting.

NY Rising: We were asked by the NY Rising representative to adopt a resolution to allow us to be a sub-recipient through the State for the \$3 million funds for flood mitigation projects. Due to timing and several concerns raised by the Town attorney we will not be adopting the resolution to move this forward at this time. We hope these issues will be resolved within the coming month and anticipate a resolution on this matter for next month's meeting.

Budget: We are starting to work on the Budget and, as usual many of the figures are not yet available. Some of the preliminary figures for Retirement are looking better than they have in the past as the State is starting to accrue some returns on their investments. Our largest concerns are over the cost of healthcare, insurance and Recycling, which I have a meeting to attend later this week concerning changes in their billing and contract with the Town. We are also concerned with standard cost increases for materials across the board. We will be losing a revenue line once the Phoenicia Library moves into their new digs back on Main Street shortly. There is no hard or soft numbers on what we can anticipate, but be assured that the Town will work diligently to keep any tax increases to bare minimum as we have demonstrated these past few years. I will be releasing a Tentative Budget toward the end of the month, which will be considered at our next month's Board meeting.

LFA: Lastly, but certainly not least we have several representatives from the newly hired Town Engineering firm of Milone and MacBroom. They are here tonight to give us an introduction to a flood mitigation action that we are initiating to address flood levels in the Hamlets of Phoenicia and Mt. Tremper. They will be seeking input at subsequent meetings that will take place within those specific hamlets and by next summer hope to compile a list of projects and funding sources to start implementation of whatever project(s) are the most effective and cost efficient. This project is paid for through a grant provided by the Ashokan Watershed Stream Management Program and the NYC DEP. If all goes well with this project, we anticipate doing similar projects in other hamlets of the Town in the future. Tonight is more of an introduction, but Mark, Jeanine and the rest of the team are more than willing to investigate every option provided to them over the next coming months, this is a very open and public process that will play out over the winter and into next spring. They will return to a Town Board meeting toward the close of the project to present their findings.









Hydraulic Modeling – Esopus Creek
