Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity

Month of July 2016

FLOOD MITIGATION: Tonight we have a resolution to begin the process to investigate the feasibility of relocating two buildings on Main Street adjacent to the Stony Clove Creek. The owner, Alfred Peavy, has agreed to pursue this action and we look forward seeing the outcome. The CWC has funding for this activity which we hope will only take a few months to complete. Once completed we will report the findings back to the Town Board where we will further discuss how to proceed from that point. If all goes well, this will be the first step in moving forward the larger plan for helping to mitigate flooding levels along Main Street and for a majority of Phoenicia.

Additionally, the Highway Superintendent, myself and a few others from the SAFARI group met with NYS DOT personnel concerning the Mt. Tremper Bridge. The State has recently added that bridge to a list for replacement. We wanted to enlighten them to some of the modeling we've already performed concerning flood elevations and mitigating options that were highlighted in the recent Local Flood Analysis, which we have. The DOT representatives seemed very receptive to our input and there may be further discussions with them concerning any modifications to the bridge to assist our community's efforts.

Lastly, CWC is working toward securing language which would pay for anchoring of above ground fuel storage tanks. This is something SAFARI has discussed in regard to our new flood ordinances, which we will be adopting sometime this fall. Anchoring of these tanks would again help make our community more resilient to the threat of flood. Securin fuel tanks will help our homes can run post-flood, and protect your lawn, neighborhood and the streams from the threat of hazardous pollution. This funding will be available to anyone located within the floodplain within any Town which has a completed and accepted an LFA. MEDICAL ARTS BUILDING: The Town has owned the buildings opposite the Post Office in Phoenicia for a number of years now. It has previously housed Benedictine Medical Services, Maverick West Healthcare and most recently the Phoenicia Library. We had a few inquiries into use of

the building but none have come to fruition due to a multitude of reasons. We have had contact with another party concerning providing medical and mental health services, but these talks are in the extremely early stages. In the interim, the building itself has seen better days. We recently had a local contractor inspect both the main building and the smaller building which currently houses our ambulance personnel. Following inspection several deficiencies were noted. All the repairs necessary could cost over \$60,000. Several projects were highlighted including roofing, siding, basement entry, exterior and interior painting along with some minor cosmetic work on the interior of both buildings. Recognizing the desire to rent this structure and the way things can deteriorate quickly within a structure the Town Board is looking to go out for bids for the most pressing issues; those being the roof and basement entry for the main building. This work would help seal the building better from moisture and mold intrusion. We are looking for bids on each of these jobs independent of the other, but that is not to say the same firm or contractor, could be awarded both jobs. The Town Board will review these bids next month and decide how to proceed on this work and future work.

RECREATION: We have several annual resolutions concerning Summer Recreation. First is appointing our staff for the Summer Recreation Program. Rayla and Manny feel confident in this year's group of young men and women and are looking forward to another enjoyable year with the kids. New this year we will be offering to pay the Junior Counselors in the instances where a regular counselor is unavailable, out sick or off for the day. This will give Rayla and Manny the opportunity to see how they handle the responsibility, will provide the Junior Counselor a bit more job experience and a little bit of compensation for their work.

We are also awaiting the bid for transportation to and from our annual field trips. This year we are looking forward to affording the kids a trip to the United Nations in NYC. We feel this will be a unique experience for the kids and many of the chaperones, as some have expressed that they themselves have never had the opportunity to visit this international destination. Of course, the trip the kids adore is the annual trip to Zoom Flume Water Park in Durham, NY generally during the last week of camp. We wish the campers and the staff a warm, sunny summer.

MISCELLANEOUS: We have a few other issues on the agenda for tonight. Ulster County has informed us that they have \$2,000 in forfeiture monies due to the Town from work our Police Department assisted in with the Ulster Regional Gang Enforcement Task (URGENT) Force. These monies will be accepted and held in the forfeiture account to assist the Police Department in offsetting costs for future equipment or materials. At the same time Ulster County has informed each of the Towns that they are holding us all to a requirement whereby the Town Highway Superintendent must submit a form (FORM 284) outlining scheduled road and bridge repairs for each fiscal year. The Town Board must review and approve the FORM 284 illustrating the costs of the repairs as outlined in the fiscal year budget. The Town Highway Superintendent will have to perform this duty and submit annually to the Town Board from here on out.

RESIGNATIONS: We are sad to report that Fionna Tanzillo, who was elected as one of our three assessors during the most recent election, has rendered her resignation. Ms. Tanzillo has expressed her desire to continue on with her work as an assessor, but that recently her personal work has grown dramatically and she does not feel that she could provide the kind of commitment that the Assessor's job entails. She is willing to stay on until the end of this year, though. As a technicality, she has submitted her resignation to the elected positon effective July 31st. This allows time for the Board of Elections to recognize the opening and for our local political parties to hold caucuses and nominating petitions in order to place names on the ballot for the election to be held this November. Ms. Tanzillo has agreed to stay on as the appointed interim assessor until December 31, 2016 where on January 1, 2017 whomever is elected will take over those responsibilities and fill those duties for the remainder of Ms. Tanzillo's unexpired term (December 31, 2019).

Lastly, but certainly not least, is the resignation of our Ambulance Chief whose name no one on this board can properly pronounce. He will remain with us as a paramedic, but is resigning his duties as Chief of the Department effective July 15th. In his stead he has suggested that another Paramedic with the service be appointed as Chief. Brendan Whalen has been a paramedic and Training Officer for the Town Ambulance Department for a number of years and the Town Board has a resolution to hire him as the Interim Chief for the Department. We will continue to evaluate Mr. Whalen's effectiveness as he transitions into this new position and look forward to seeing him uphold the very high standards that have been set by previous administrators for this Award-Winning Department.

Upon his resignation Chief Muellerieile, or "La-La" as some of us refer to him, leaves some very big shoes to fill. Of course, he will still be working with our Department and is retaining some bawdy title with County EMS, so if a problem arises we will be sure to find a way to blame him. I say this jokingly, but at the same time hope some of you recognize the weight that the Chief of any Emergency Response Department carries at all times. This is not to take away the hard work and dedication all our responders, but as Chief it is exceptional. They are never "off-duty," as an emergency can arise at any time. They have to keep current with all the regulations, certifications, licenses, approvals, boards and all the organizations that impact the operation of their Department. Aside from the actual field work, they must perform as administrative coordinator, budget officer, field general, complaint department, moderator, psychologist, social worker and if you're lucky enough; friend. I have been a first-hand witness to the personal and professional growth of Chief Muelleleile especially during the maelstrom we commonly refer to as Irene. The Town cannot express its gratitude in your service to the Town and I cannot express the full satisfaction I have in finally being rid of you. In all honesty, you have done an exemplary job as Chief and a pretty commendable job as my friend. The Town and I wish you the very best in you coming endeavors and we'll leave a key under the mat for you. Mr. Whalen I only have one bit of advice for you in moving up to being Chief, DO NOT UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE click on the shaded areas on the payroll spreadsheets.

ADVERTISE FOR BIDS FOR REPAIRS TO TOWN OWNED BUILDING
