This past month was an incredibly busy one for the Ambulance Service, and call volume was unbelievable during the weekends. As it is great to see new faces visiting the Town, the continuing issues that stem from our adventurous transient population is incredibly taxing upon our existing services. One weekend for example, we found ourselves with a hiker rescue call that dedicated our resources for six hours, and we had three life threatening calls for service in our District during that timeframe. One call required multiple ambulances from as far as the Town of Hurley for transport of five unstable patients. Thankfully, off duty Ambulance employees were able to staff our second ambulance, and handle all of the other calls with the exception of the multiple patient incident. Many thanks to those Ambulance employees who came in off duty, and our neighboring emergency responders who came to assist as well.

Believe it or not, once the hiker was extricated from the woods by State Police helicopter, the patient refused medical attention and walked away. At the sake of sounding like a broken record- if you come to hike, know what you're doing. If something happens when you are in the wilderness you're not only putting rescuers at risk at an incredible expense both figuratively and literally, but are tying up resources that could be used to help others in need. Please, exercise some common sense.

COVID UPDATE- As of 9/13, there are 698 active cases of COVID in Ulster County. There are 8 active cases in the Town of Shandaken at this time. Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 127, with 119 recovered. Thankfully to date we have had no fatalities. Total cumulative cases in the County have reached 17,501, with 698 active cases, and 274 fatalities. 16,529 cases have successfully recovered.

- 1. To enforce all local laws, ordinances and regulations of the Town of Shandaken.
- 2. To enforce the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York to the extent that police officers may be so permitted by the general laws of the State of New York.
- 3. To enforce such Penal Statutes as police officers are permitted to enforce pursuant to the general laws of the State of New York, and in furtherance of said special duties police officers are hereby authorized the use, of a Town Vehicle to be known as a police officer's vehicle which may be equipped with emergency lights in accordance with applicable sections of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, and may use the State and County radio to the extent permitted by the general laws of the State of New York, and may carry fire arms while on duty in compliance with the general laws of the State of New York pertaining to Police Officers generally.
