## **Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity**

## Month of February 2016

**Zoning and Building:** Tonight we have a Resolution to update some of the fees for Zoning and Planning activities. Our Code Officer, Warren Tutt, reviewed these and compared them to many of our neighboring municipalities. Since these fees have not been updated in some time many are out of line with what our neighbors charge for the same services. It should also be noted that, as with much of municipal governance these days, the work and paperwork required on behalf of the Code Officer is becoming more extensive requiring more of his time to complete. These fees have been reviewed by the Planning Board and recommended for approval. These fees will take effect upon adoption of the resolution tonight.

**Highway:** We have a number of resolutions tonight pertaining to necessary work to maintain our infrastructure. The first is to accept bids pertaining to a Slope Failure in Muddy Brook that went out to bid last year. The next two are to go out for bid for two bridges that failed during Irene. The Peck Hollow Bridge is to be funded by FEMA and the Pantherkill Bridge is to be paid through NY Rising funds. We hope to have solid bids for both by next month and possibly move this work to construction over the coming spring and summer.

Furthermore, Eric, Town Board member DiSclafani and I met with the CSEA representative and members of the Highway Department last week. It appears we have reached an accord agreeable to the members present. I cannot divulge any details at this time as the agreement needs to be ratified by the entire Department, but if all goes well we hope to have a resolution to adopt the new contract next month.

**Ambulance:** I have continued working on the calculations on the Back Wages for the Ambulance Personnel. It appears our initial estimate of costs was lower than anticipated at first glance as numbers have escalated over \$100,000. I have one employee left to calculate, then we have to await full review by the Department of Labor

to ensure that my calculations are correct. If approved by the US DOL we will most likely have a resolution next month to dispense the wages owed.

Additionally, Chief Muellerleile and I have further reviewed our billing rates as we were notified at the end of last year that we were severely below local and regional averages for the charges billed. I'd like the Board to review these figures over the coming month and we will probably entertain a resolution at next month's meeting to upgrade these rates.

Sales Tax: Lastly, there has been a rather recent and abrupt discussion from the County Legislature pertaining to Sales Tax revenues and the agreement the County has to share this revenue with the Towns and the City of Kingston. The County Legislators are trying to justify reducing the shares given respectively to the Towns from 3% to 2%. The Towns and the City of Kingston are uniform in resisting this change. The small portion of Sales Tax revenue afforded each of us contributes greatly to helping us keep the taxes as low as possible in the face of the Tax Cap regulation and escalating costs for Healthcare, general services and infrastructure provided from the local municipalities. This measure is misguided and short-sighted. Here in Shandaken, as in all the Towns, this move would reduce our revenue from sales tax 33% equivalent to \$40,000. To recoup those costs the revenue would have to come directly from your property tax. That would've equated to a 2.25% increase in your property tax which, of course, excludes any increases due to healthcare cost increases, salaries, office materials and infrastructure. Know that the County derives its revenues from a large variety of sources, but not principally your property tax, as stated above they receive 97% of the Sales Tax revenues generated by the local towns. Conversely, the local municipalities' revenues are primarily laden directly from your property tax which is why many at the local level work diligently to try and keep them to the minimum.

We are your neighbors and appear before you, if not throughout your daily routines, but publically at meetings held close to your homes. The Legislators, at times, seem to govern on high and come up with what they feel are grandiose schemes that appear to benefit you and try selling it to you like a "Sham Wow!" infomercial. I ask each of you to call your legislator and voice your opposition to this plan. Further, I ask each of you to request your respective legislator to attend a local governing board meeting and explain their position on this matter. The Supervisors and Mayors of Ulster County are united in this effort and need your support.

The bitter cold months of winter are upon us and despite the somewhat mild respite from the norm that we have had for the past few months- it seems everyone is trying to warm up no matter where you go. With this we habitually see a surge in the number of carbon monoxide alarm calls, chimney fires, and structure fire callsparticularly in the months of January and February.

At the sake of sounding like a broken record PLEASE do the following to safeguard yourself and your families during the peak heating season as these are just a few of the issues we encounter the most;

- Ensure that you have multiple WORKING smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, and test them regularly.
- Have heating appliances and chimneys properly serviced and cleaned at prescribed intervals.
- When disposing of woodburning stove debris PLEASE dispose of it away from the house/ combustibles.
- Give space heaters SPACE. Do not utilize space heaters near combustibles.
- Keep children and pets away from heating appliances.

As household fires, carbon monoxide poisioning, and burns are rare events, they pose a huge risk this time of year and have longlasting effects on everyone involved. Please be safe and enjoy the rest of the few cold months remaining!
