Far too many times the unfortunate reality exists in our rural area that emergency care is delayed to those in need secondary to their addresses being poorly marked for Emergency Responders. Lately, this has become ever apparent-particularly for individuals unfamiliar with their hamlet, or visitors that are staying transiently.

It is the mission of the Town of Shandaken Ambulance to deliver the highest level of care to our citizens, businesses, and visitors without delay. This is done in concert with our dedicated Fire Departments, and Police Department. Therefore, the Ambulance Service is launching a campaign, alongside our public safety partners to provide reflective address signs and numbers to any address that does not have one permanently affixed and visible from the roadside at no cost to the homeowner within our Town.

The process is simple- if you are a property owner in need of a sign, email the Ambulance Department at <u>ambulance@shandaken.us</u>. If you don't like the World Wide Web, call (845) 901-0228 during regular business hours. We will notify the appropriate Fire Department/ participating agency that services your area in Town that provides signs, or provide instructions for the pickup of your sign at Town Hall to be posted conspicuously at the entrance to your property. If assistance is needed for installation in <u>extreme</u> circumstances, please specify that upon your phone call or E-mail.

There is no excuse for delay in care to those in need, and it is the duty of all that serve Shandaken to assure the prompt response for all that enjoy the fruits of our great Town. Please take advantage of this program ASAP.

COVID UPDATE-. As of 7/8/22 there are 3 active cases of COVID in the Town of Shandaken. Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 339, with 335 recovered. There is still only one fatality accounted for in the Town. There are 197 active cases of COVID in Ulster County, with cumulative cases in the County reaching 44,852. There are a total of 389 cumulative fatalities since the beginning of the Pandemic in the County, and a total of 44,266 individuals recovered.

APPOINTMENT OF OUTREACH AND ASSESSMENT LEADS FOR THE VOLUNTARY NYC FUNDED FLOOD BUYOUT PROGRAM FOR FLOOD MITIGATION

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken by Resolution # 95 of 2017 opted in to Categories One through Five of a voluntary New York City-Funded Flood Buyout (NYCFFBO) Program; and

WHEREAS, the Revised 2007 Filtration Avoidance Determination (FAD) of 2012 required New York City to fund a Flood Mitigation Program; and

WHEREAS, one component of that program includes a voluntary NYC-Funded Flood Buyout Program (NYCFFBO) that was renewed and continued in the 2017 FAD; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the voluntary NYCFFBO for village and hamlet designated areas to consider in the New York City watershed have been completed. Unlike the existing Land Acquisition Program, these acquisitions are solely for the purpose of flood mitigation efforts with the agreement of the involved municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken Flood Mitigation Plan identifies supporting the purchase, relocation or retrofitting of structures located in hazard-prone areas to protect structures and public infrastructure from future damages and to ensure the Town of Shandaken eligibility for State and Federal Hazard Mitigation monies; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken agreed to support eligible landowners to participate in the Hurricane Irene Flood Buyout Program funded by the NYS Emergency Management Office and FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program and administered by Ulster County Office of Emergency Management in conjunction with the New York City DEP and Ulster County Department of Environment; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken, will not be charged with funding the expenses for the Outreach and Assessment Leads for the NYCFFBO; and

WHEREAS, participating municipalities in the NYCFFBO are to provide a resolution designating the Outreach and Assessment Lead(s) to facilitate and represent the community through the process; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken recognizes it may choose to conduct these tasks independently or where no local entity is willing or able to undertake these roles, NYC Department of Environmental

Protection, the Catskill Watershed Corporation, or their respective consultants would be available to be the Outreach or Assessment Lead for a particular category of property; and

WHEREAS, the NYCFFBO Program will not acquire properties unless the proposed acquisition is agreed to by the Town of Shandaken based on the specific procedure(s) used to confirm such municipal concurrence as documented in the "NYC-Funded Flood Buyout Program Property Evaluation and Selection Process" dated June 1, 2016.

Now, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Town of Shandaken designates Heidi Emrich of the Ulster County Department of Environment, through a contractual Agreement with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County (CCEUC) as the Outreach Lead for Categories One through Five; and Assessment Lead for Category Five. The Town of Shandaken designates Ulster County Soil and Water Conservation District as the Assessment Lead for Category Four; and

BE IT YET FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town of Shandaken may change the Outreach and Assessment Leads at any time in the future, as well as there may be unique individual community circumstances and needs that may enable either the Outreach or Assessment Lead to be the only lead needed by the community.

WHEREAS the Town of Shandaken is subject to flooding that can damage property, close businesses, disrupt traffic, and present a public health and safety hazard; and

WHEREAS the Town of Shandaken recognizes it is in the citizens' best interest to understand flooding impacts on the municipality's infrastructure, private and public property, and water quality in order to proactively plan and respond to such impacts; and

WHEREAS the Town of Shandaken supports participating in the Local Flood Analysis to help inform its flood hazard mitigation efforts in order to better understand the nature of flood events and risks at different storm intervals, and where through various structural and non-structural options may exist to reduce surface water flooding in the hamlets; and

WHEREAS funding support from Ashokan Watershed Stream Management Program (AWSMP) through its Stream Management Implementation program (SMIP) grant fund can be obtained to help prepare a Local Flood Analysis for eligible hamlet areas; and

WHEREAS Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County, a participating agency of the AWSMP, will coordinate the funding provision and administration of payment for engineering services for Local Flood Analysis during the term of an executed SMIP Grant Agreement with the Town of Shandaken; and

WHEREAS the Town of Shandaken has entered a contract with the selected consultant and AWSMP has approved SMIP grant funding of the Local Flood Analysis, using the consultant's technical and cost proposals as Scope of Work in the application; and

WHEREAS the Town of Shandaken's authorized representative has provided written approval of payment(s) to the selected consultant for Local Flood Analysis; and

WHEREAS Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County will pay any and all costs associated with a signed SMIP Grant Agreement providing the engineering services, as the funding has been provided for such purpose by contract between Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County and New York City Department of Environmental Protection; and

WHEREAS the following provision has been duly approved by a majority vote of the Shandaken Board and by approval of CCEUC, the parties agree as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED The Supervisor of the Town of Shandaken is authorized to provide Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County with written approval of invoice payment to the town's consultant in accordance with the subject of the terms of the SMIP Grant Agreement for the Local Flood Analysis.
