

Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity

MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2017

SHANDAKEN SEPTIC DISTRICT: A little over a month ago the Town was given a

presentation concerning the establishment of a Septic Maintenance District for the Hamlet of Shandaken. The formation of a District, if approved by the residents of the proposed District, would provide the Town a fund to help residents repair or replace their septic systems if needed. At the meeting it was discussed that if the Town wished to consider this project further it would require the Town Board pass a resolution to accept moving forward through the process, adding that at multiple times throughout, if the Town Board or residents which to decline this offer, we retain that option through several steps until the beginning of construction. The resolution tonight simply moves this project into a more detailed engineering investigation in order to better evaluate the options and costs associated.

DEP FLOOD BUYOUTS: There are two resolutions tonight regarding properties where the owners have inquired about being bought out by NYC DEP due to their location within the Floodplain and/or Floodway. With each the Town has the option to either take ownership of the parcel or have the DEP take possession.

The first parcel is along Station Rd in Phoenicia and is in an area that was identified in the Phoenicia Flood Analysis report as part of a larger project which would help reduce flood elevations in Phoenicia. It is currently held by Ulster County for non-payment of taxes. They are offering it up recognizing it is part of a larger proposed project area. NYC DEP will provide the funds to demolish any structures located on the parcel and purchase the property. The Town is requesting ownership, which occurs without any cost to the taxpayer, of this parcel as we have recognized that if the project were to proceed it would require funding from multiple state and federal sources. Town ownership makes it much easier to apply for funding to proceed with such a project as opposed to the legal wrangling that would ensue to perform a project on property not owned by the municipality.

The second parcel, privately owned, is along Plank Rd in Mt. Tremper. It is a sizable parcel wholly within the floodplain and floodway, but is not part of any proposed project area. The property is actually a number of rivulets along the Esopus Creek. The Town is asking that the DEP retain ownership of this parcel as they already own an adjacent parcel. It would still be available for recreational activity, as with other DEP owned properties, but we are not requesting any formal fishing access point or maintenance of this parcel.

These resolutions are required under the NYC Funded Flood Buyout Program rules and help the owners move forward with DEP in appraisals and negotiations for the purchase of the properties. These resolutions do not guarantee that the parcels will complete the process as the landowner may choos e to longer participate to a certain point.

MUSEUM BOILER: We have several reports from the Museum Board over sometime regarding the inadequacy of the boiler at the Museum. Our repair options have helped hold it together for some time, but that time came to a close when the boiler failed last weekend. We received several bids and are looking to hire a firm to replace the boiler with a newer high-efficiency boiler. We will utilize Good Neighbor funds for this repair. We hope to have the boiler replaced before the end of the month as the air is already starting to get quite chilly in Pine Hill.

CAMPAIGN SIGNAGE: As always at this time of year, we have our annual resolution asking candidates not to place campaign signs out for the General Election prior to Columbus Day. This is a memorializing resolution and simply a neighborly request to allow our residents and visitors the right to view the fall foliage in its unspoiled splendor. I'm sure a few of you may be questioning sign that are currently out along the roads, this is for several Primaries in several parties that are taking place tomorrow (Tuesday, September 12th from 12 noon until 9pm). Of course, I'm assured the candidates will be removing these signs following those primaries and I ask all of you to make sure you get tomorrow and exercise your right to vote.

2018 BUDGET: Before the end of the month I will be releasing a Tentative Budget for next year. As always we will work to try and keep the taxes down without reducing the services we offer. There are quite a few Factors that will dramatically effecting this year's budget from the increase in the NYS State Minimum Wage, an already reported 10% increase in Healthcare costs, an increase in Retirement costs and an additional payroll period. I am already preparing for an increase, but I'm hoping to keep it as minimal as possible. There are other factors as we have to prepare for other costs in several departments due to egal issues and still trying to improve the services we do offer. The Tentative 2018 Budget will be released by the end of this month.

PINE HILL: Pine Hill resident Barbara Hagstrom helped to gather a few folks over this past weekend in Pine Hill and they scraped, primed and painted the main entrance sign. I would like to extend our gratitude for helping to organize this and for all the volunteers that helped get this done this past Saturday.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, October 2, 2017 at 7 pm.

Good evening Supervisor Stanley, members of the board, and town residents.

As summer comes to an end and the weather starts to get crisper and colder. I would like to remind everyone as they start or have started to turn on their heat for the first time, to make sure that your heaters and fire places get serviced by a professional technician. Also, to make sure that everyone has a working smoke detector and CO detector that are in date. Most CO detectors are only good for 7 to 10 years from date of manufacture and will also start to give warnings when they are starting to fail. The date is usually on the back of the unit by the battery and/or plug. As always if they start to go off please leave your house right away and call 911. Do not start to open windows and doors trying to air out the house, this makes it harder for the fire department to find the source of the issues. Make sure that both the smoke detectors and CO detected have fresh batteries and are test at least every 6 months, best way to remember is when you turn back your clocks to also change the batteries and do a test. In closing I would also like everyone to take time and remember all the Fire, EMS, Police, and people that lost their lives 16 years ago on 9/11/2001. Have a good night and safe month.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF SHANDAKEN AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN PRE-CONSTRUCTION PHASE OF THE WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT PROJECT IN THE HAMLET OF SHANDAKEN

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken previously entered into an agreement (the "Agreement") with the Catskill Watershed Corporation ("CWC") to participate in the Community Wastewater Management Program, which program will provide for the design and construction of a wastewater management program project in the Hamlet of Shandaken; and

WHEREAS, CWC's consultant for the Program, Lamont Engineers, has prepared a Preliminary Engineer's Report for the Hamlet of Shandaken, final version dated June, 2017 evaluating various alternative methods for managing the wastewater needs of the Hamlet of Shandaken, such report marking the end of the Study Phase of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Town has reviewed the Preliminary Engineer's Report prepared by Lamont Engineers; and

WHEREAS, based upon its review of the Preliminary Engineer's Report and Supplement, the Town Board wishes to proceed to the Pre-Construction phase of the Project as set forth in Section 2.05 of the Agreement, such schedule to be agreed upon by the Town and CWC; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.05(A) of the Agreement, the Town must acknowledge in writing its desire to continue into the Pre-Construction Phase of the Project within ninety (90) days; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.06(B) of the Agreement, the Town may terminate participation in the program if the bids received by the Town for construction are greater than the amount reserved for that purpose in the Block Grant, and the Town and CWC are unable to agree to modifications to the Program to bring the anticipated cost within the Block Grant amount;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED;

- 1. The Town of Shandaken by and through its Town Board, desires to continue with the Pre-Construction Phase of the Community Wastewater Program for the Hamlet of Shandaken, and
- 2. The Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute any and all Documents for the Hamlet of Shandaken on behalf of the Town as may be necessary to continue with the Pre-Construction Phase.

27 STATION RD., PHOENICIA, NY

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken is subject to flooding that can damage property, close roads, disrupt traffic, and present a public health and safety hazard; and

WHEREAS, at the request of local communities, funding from the NYC Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is being made available to help property owners who qualify for the NYC Funded Flood Buyout Program (NYCFFBO) based on eligibility criteria in five categories – 1) Hydraulic study properties (recommended by engineering analysis), 2) CWC Flood Hazard Mitigation Implementation Program, 3) Community-approved Stream Management Project, 4) Erosion Hazard, and 5) Inundation Hazard, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken has conducted a Local Flood Analysis (LFA) including a hydraulic analysis of flooding in the Town and the LFA recommends certain properties that are subject to repetitive flood damages should be considered for flood buyout, and

WHEREAS, the property at **27 Station Rd., Phoenicia, NY 12464** (Section Block Lot 14.13-3-49) has been recommended for consideration for buyout in the LFA and the Town has been approached by **County of Ulster**, the owner of the property, requesting to participate in the NYCFFBO program under the Hydraulic study category, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken has the option to decline ownership of the property choosing instead that the City of New York own the property but has the desire to own this property for future flood mitigation activities, and

WHEREAS, The Town of Shandaken understands that this Town-owned property will be managed by the Town in conjunction with a Re-Use Plan prepared by the Town that identifies the community's long term plan for the management, use, and development of this parcel. All activities are to be subject to and consistent with the restrictions in Flood-Prone Areas identified in the Second Supplemental Agreement Among West of Hudson Watershed Stakeholders Concerning the New York City-Funded Flood Buyout Program, Page 5 (1) a., i., ii., iii., iv., and v.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, The Town of Shandaken Town Board approves County of Ulster, homeowners of **27 Station Rd.**, Phoenicia, NY 12464 to apply for the NYCFBO program to permanently remove this flood hazard risk allowing the DEP to begin assisting them in the real estate process.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Town of Shandaken Town Board opts to retain ownership of the parcel for future flood mitigation activities.
