



# Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity MONTH OF MAY 2019

SHANDAKEN SEPTIC DISTRICT: As you may recall, March 30th the Hamlet of

Shandaken residents voted overwhelmingly in favor of creating the Shandaken Septic Maintenance District. Our resolution tonight finalizes the organization of the District and engineers are looking to go out to bid over the next few months to start working on approximately 30 systems in the District which are in need of repairs or replacement. We anticipate this work to continue throughout the summer and into the fall. Once the work is completed the NYC DEP Funding will be turned over to the Town for future repairs and maintenance of septic systems within the District. This work is being provided without any cost to the property owners.

**RECREATION:** We have a resolution tonight to advertise for a Summer Recreation Director and Assistant Director. This is not to say we are wholly dissatisfied with the current personnel we are just doing some due diligence to see if there are other options available to operate our Summer Recreation Program. Both positions are Part-Time for three days a week for eight weeks and pay \$650 and \$450 per week and will be in charge of approximately 10-12 Counselors overseeing 80-100 children ages 5- 16. Anyone interested should send an application to my office before Wednesday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> so we can conduct interviews prior to our next Town Board meeting. Of course we are always seeking Summer Camp Counselors, as well. Anyone interested in a Counselor position should send their application to my office as well. Counselors will be selected by the eventual Recreation Director and Assistant.

Parks & Recreation Board: I am saddened to report that Martie Gailes, who has served as the Chair of the Parks and Recreation Board, has submitted her resignation. Martie has done a fantastic job helping to provide guidance for continuing improvements at all of our Town Parks and childrens' programs over the past few years. We are sorry to see her go and will be looking for someone to take the position as Martie can never be "replaced." It has also come to my attention that upon Carol Urban's passing a few months ago, we are still in need of a Park Manager for the Parish Field in Phoenicia. Anyone interested in either of these positions should reach me in my office. These are volunteer positions for 3 year seats.

MISC.: We have resolutions to hire a surveyor for the Highway Department, of which we only received one bid from C.T. Male Associates, in order to help solidify boundaries for certain roads throughout the Town, and another to renew our five year lease agreement for the Emerson Soccer Fields in Mt. Tremper. Additionally we have our annual resolution for the Public Assembly Permit for the Phoenicia International Festival of the Voice celebrating its 10<sup>th</sup> year of operation which will be taking place August 2<sup>nd</sup> through the 4<sup>th</sup>.

# FIRE DEPARTMENT GRANT: Last month we approved applying to NYS for grants

regarding Phoenicia Water Work and Planning Activities. Under Planning Grants we will now also be applying for an efficiency grant on behalf of the Pine Hill and Highmount Fire Protection District (currently contracted to the Pine Hill Fire Company) and are happy to work with the Big Indian-Oliverea Fire Department. Our Fire Departments are necessary resource and have been straddled with increasing requirements for duty, reductions in personnel and financially burdening mandates. In an effort to try and see how to address these issues moving forward we will be applying for a grant to look at possible ways to more efficiently and effectively operate in the hopes of helping to reduce any redundancies and costs for the taxpayers of these districts. These recommendations may include sharing of services or equipment and may include options for possible consolidation. Please note that if awarded, any findings or recommendations would be left to the Agency Having Jurisdiction. In the case of the Pine Hill and Highmount Fire Protection Districts that would be the Town Board and the Pine Hill Fire Company Board of Directors, in the Big Indian-Oliverea Fire District that would be their Board of Commissioners. The \$10,000 grant requires a 50% match of \$5,000 from the applicant. Noting that the Shandaken taxpayers of these districts would be the ultimate beneficiaries, I would propose that the Town cover this match from within the existing Town Budget.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, June 3, 2019 at 7:00 pm.

#### ESTABLISH SHANDAKEN SEPTIC MAINTENANCE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, A resolution having been adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken, New York (the "Town"), on December 3, 2018, the Town Board adopted a resolution accepting and adopting the materials needed for the formation of the Shandaken Septic Maintenance District ("Septic Maintenance District" or "District"), including a description of the proposed District, reciting that the cost of the formation of the District will be fully subsidized by the City of New York and potentially State and Federal grants, directing a copy of the Engineer's Report and Plan, Service Area Map, and a detailed explanation of the costs to each residential and non-residential landowner to be placed in the Town Clerk's office and made available for public inspection, and specifying that said Town Board shall meet at the Shandaken Town Hall, Town of Shandaken, New York on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of January, 2019, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on such proposal to establish the District and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, and a hearing having been duly held by said Board at such time and place, it having been duly resolved and determined following such hearing that the notice of hearing was published and posted as required by law and otherwise sufficient, that all the property owners within the proposed District were benefitted thereby, that all property owners benefitted were included within the limits of the proposed District, and that it was in public interest to grant in whole the relief sought, and it having been then and further duly resolved that the establishment of such District as proposed be approved, subject to permissive referendum in the manner provided in Town Law Article 7, and a certificate of the Town Clerk having been filed pursuant to Town Law § 209-e(4), certifying the results of the special election held on March 30, 2019 stating that a majority of the residents of the District voted in favor of the establishment of the District, and the permission of the State Comptroller not being required pursuant to Town Law § 209-f.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the District be established in the Town and designated as the Shandaken Septic Maintenance District with the description and boundaries as set forth in Exhibit A; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Town Clerk of the Town of Shandaken is hereby authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be duly recorded in the Office of the Clerk of Ulster County in which the Town is located, within ten (10) after the adoption of this order; and

BE IT YET FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this order with the New York State Comptroller's Office, Albany, New York, within ten (10) days after the adoption of this order.
