Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity

Month of November 2014

2015 Budget: There is not much change proposed from what we adopted as the Preliminary Budget. Except two major issues which are helping to reduce the taxes in both the General Fund and the Phoenicia Water District

*Health Insurance - We received final figures from our agent concerning the current CDPHP Plan available for our employees. The rates were a considerable increase over what was initially anticipated. As stated last month, those numbers showed a near 13% increase over this year's costs. At our request the agent was able to find a similar High Deductible Plan through MVP. By changing back to MVP, the impact on the employees' costs are similar to what we had anticipated under the CDPHP plan (around 6%), the difference is that it carries a lower deductible which saves the Town General Fund approximately \$15,000, which we've reduced directly from the anticipated taxes for next year. This change drops the General Tax rate by almost a full percentage point. It also further reduces our spending for a total reduction in spending of \$35,000 or roughly 1.5%.

*Phoenicia Water — After more thorough information has become available it appears that the pump in Phoenicia will be more expensive than anticipated. The engineer has given an estimate of \$70,000 for the pump installation and all extraneous work that would have to be performed in order for the pump to be replaced. Alfred Peavy, the Chair of the Phoenicia Water District Committee, met with Candace Balmer, of RCAP Solutions, and I to look into the possibility of receiving a grant for this work. Recognizing the scope of work to be completed I proposed that we hold off on the pump for this coming year. Change the anticipated Loan repayment to a Capital Reserve line and reduce the amount by \$3,000 thus reducing the tax increase from 25% to 17%. We also feel that we can reduce the overall cost of the project by parsing out certain smaller jobs that would need to be completed to prepare for the pump's placement out of existing appropriations for the Water District. Candace will be here next month to do a presentation on tasks needed for the application. For instance, we will have to send out income surveys to all Phoenicia Water District users as required for the Grant

application. The grant application would be due in May or June of 2015 and we would know by September whether we will receive it. If we get it, the job can proceed without financially crippling the District. If we don't get the grant, we will have \$7,500 banked for the project plus and additional \$7,500 the following year giving the district \$15,000 to offset the amount to be borrowed while still completing the smaller jobs. This ultimately will get the job completed and reduce the overall cost of payback giving district users a quicker return on their investment.

*Recycling – We did receive good word this month as the Resource Recovery Agency has given notice that they are retracting their proposed fees for recyclables and that they are not requiring a long-term open-ended contract with the Towns. Our recycling costs will not go up, but solid waste, whom we contract through Saugerties, will still be going up by Mid-July next year. I have not received word on the anticipated cost for Shandaken from Saugerties, yet. I would not suggest reducing the anticipated increase in the budget.

***OVERALL – General – With all the changes the General Budget spending is Down 1.46%, meaning the proposed spending is near \$35,000 less than this year. The \$102,000 drop in non-taxable revenues is what creates a 4% increase on the General Tax levy. Highway – The spending is up 3% and the tax levy reflects the same, mostly due to contractual expenses and Salt. Overall – The accountant assures me that we will not need to pass a resolution to exceed the tax cap. Understand that the tax cap calculations are complicated but essentially if you don't use up your 'cap space' from previous years, then it is retained as a reserve available cumulatively over a three year span. So because we had 0% last year and 1% the year before we have enough reserve space in cap space. To better explain the cumulative tax increase, including the Special Districts, is roughly 3.4% which in turn translates to an increase of \$34 in taxes if you paid \$1000 in Town taxes last year, which of course is barring any change in your assessment. We have resolutions to first adopt the Preliminary Budget as the Final Budget tonight.

Shandaken Sewer: On October 23rd the Town Board met with Representatives of the CWC and their engineers Lamont Engineering. They are offering to investigate possibilities for some form of municipal sewerage or septic maintenance for the Hamlet of Shandaken. This costs the Town nothing and is fully paid by the CWC. There are several phases to this program and the Town Board will be involved as the process continues The Town Board has already expressed its desire to focus on the possibility of a Septic Maintenance District as opposed to some type of municipal plant. The resolution tonight simply authorizes the CWC to move ahead with their investigation at no cost to the Town without committing to any specific project.

NY Rising: We have a resolution tonight to authorize me to sign into the Subrecipient agreement with NYS for us to move forward with projects selected for the Town. This
involved the \$3 million dollars the State has promised us for storm recovery and resiliency
projects. Our attorney has some concerns with the agreement and the State's reluctance to
change some of the language to better protect the Town, but it appears this is a necessary
action for those funds to be released to us. Over the next few months we will most likely be
approving those projects to move forward.

Zoning: The Town is closing the Public Hearing for the proposed Zoning change in Pine Hill. We would have had resolutions to move on this action tonight, but we are awaiting comments from the County Planning Department which meets at the same time tonight. We will have resolutions for this action next month.

Misc.: We have a resolution to approve a logging permit for Bergen County

Sportsmen's Association on Rose Mtn. Rd following the Public Hearing held prior to tonight's meeting. We also have resolutions for the renewal of the URGENT contract with the Ulster Sheriff's Office, Approving the Public Assembly permit for this year's Phoenicia Turkey Trot, Authorizing the plowing of Churches and Firehouses in Town and Allowing the Highway Superintendent to auction off some old Highway equipment.

Special Announcements: Last week some members of the Ambulance, the Chief and I met with Jay Jacobs and members of the Timberlake staff. We were surprised and extremely grateful when Mr. Jacobs and the Timberlake Foundation made a \$10,000 donation to our Ambulance Department. In addition to the financial donation the camp made a donation of tubs of candy left over from the camp which the Ambulance Department dispersed the town's children on Halloween night. We cannot express enough gratitude to the Jacobs family and the Timberlake Foundation who time and again have proven to be generous benefactors on many levels throughout the Town, other than to say Thank You!

I would also like to take the opportunity to have the Board join me in recognizing Mr. Rick Ricciardella. We would like to present him a small token recognizing his commitment to the Town and specifically the Phoenicia Water District. Rick has been involved with the Water District for 23 years and been Superintendent for 20 of those. We'd like to present him this small token of our appreciation. Thanks, Rick.

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of Superstorm Sandy, the United States Congress, through Public Law passed the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act of 2013 (Public Law 113-2, approved January 29, 2013), as amended (the "Act"), appropriating \$16 billion, later reduced to \$15.18 billion, to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery ("CDBG-DR") funds for necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure, and housing and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from a major disaster declared due to Superstorm Sandy and other

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eligible events, including Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee, in calendar years 2011, 2012, and 2013 (the "Storms"), subject to the Federal statutes and regulations governing CDBG grants, as modified by exceptions and waivers previously granted and which may hereafter be granted by HUD; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the CDBG-DR Grant Program and Federal Register Notice (78 Fed. Reg. 14,329), published March 5, 2013, titled, "Allocations, Common Applications, and Alternative Requirements for Grantees Receiving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery Funds in Response to Hurricane Sandy (as amended)," the State has received an allocation of CDBG-DR funds from HUD in the amount of \$1,713,960,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the CDBG-DR Grant Program and Federal Register Notice (78 Fed. Reg. 69,104), entitled *Second Allocation, Waivers and Alternative Requirements for Grantees Receiving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery Funds in Response to Hurricane Sandy (as amended)," the State has received a second allocation of CDBG-DR funds from HUD in the amount of \$2,097,000,000; and*

WHEREAS, HUD requires the State to spend 80% of all CDBG-DR funds so allocated within the counties of Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk, Westchester, Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens, and Richmond; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with HUD directive, the Town of Shandaken has been notified of its ability to participate in the NY State Community Development Block Grant--Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR); and

WHEREAS, implementation of the CDBG-DR Recovery Program requires the execution of the Subrecipient Agreement between Town of Shandaken and the Housing Trust Fund Corporation, which will be substantially similar to the Subrecipient Agreement Template attached hereto and made a part hereof.
