#### March 2022 Report

TOTAL CALLS RECEIVED - 31

MUTUAL AID GIVEN - 3 (1- Hunter, 1- Olive, 1- Woodstock)

Thankfully, call volume in March decreased a bit from our record breaking January and February. On Wednesday, March 9th at around 2:45PM our responders were summoned to an incredibly challenging call involving a 15 passenger bus that was involved in a rollover motor vehicle accident in the area of Golf Course rd. on Route 28. A total of 11 patients were evaluated, with 6 patients transported to hospitals with injuries. As a mass casualty incident of this scale far exceeds the abilities of our own Town Fire Departments, Police, and EMS' ability to mitigate on their lonesome- particularly mid-day on a weekday- a number of agencies were called to this incident to assist in care and transport of the injured in accordance to our pre-planned response criteria with Ulster 911. Many thanks to Woodstock Fire Department Ambulance, Olive First Aid, Hunter Area Ambulance, West Hurley Ambulance, Mobile Life Support, Diaz Ambulance, and Marbletown Ambulance- all of which either responded to the scene, provided standby, or offered assistance during this call. It could have been much, much worse.

Our new ambulance is back from its radio installation, and driver training is currently occurring on a daily basis. The final step in placing the ambulance in service once driver training is completed is a New York State Department of Health inspection. This can only occur once all medical equipment has been switched from the ambulance it is replacing. As taking our second ambulance out of service to do this was risky while Belleayre remained open, it is anticipated that this will occur within the next week.

COVID UPDATE-. As of 4/2 there are 3 active cases of COVID in the Town of Shandaken. Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 287, with 283 recovered-up nearly 20 from last month. There is only one fatality accounted for in the Town, and hopefully that number doesn't change. There are 134 active cases of COVID in Ulster County- slightly up from March, with cumulative cases in the County reaching 37,830. There are a total of 373 cumulative fatalities since the beginning of the Pandemic in the County, with 37,323 individuals recovered.

## Resolution to Confirm Participation in the Process of Developing a Nomination to Extend the Catskill Mountains Scenic Byway

**WHEREAS**, the Catskill Mountains Scenic Byway (CMSB), consisting of portions of State Routes 28, 214, and 42, spanning 58 miles and involving six municipalities, was officially designated by New York State and signed into law by the Governor in 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, the Central Catskills Collaborative, comprised of representatives from each involved municipality, have worked together successfully to achieve the byway's designation and have promoted the scenic byway in the region through numerous tourism and partnership efforts; and

**WHEREAS**, the CMSB Corridor Management Plan identifies the intrinsic values that comprise the special designation and includes recommendations to protect and enhance the historic, scenic, recreational, and cultural resources along the CMSB for economic benefit; and

**WHEREAS**, the CMSB, along with regional stakeholders have worked to strengthen cooperation and the scenic byway system in the Catskill Region; and

**WHEREAS**, the towns of Roxbury, Hurley, and Middletown, and the village of Margaretville have adopted resolutions to extend the scenic byway within their municipal jurisdictions; and financial support has been secured to pursue the planning process to meet state guidelines for a nomination to extend the scenic byway;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the town of Shandaken supports extension of the CMSB and will, through its Collaborative representatives, advise and assist in the revision of the CMSB Corridor Management Plan, which will be put forth for a nomination to extend the CMSB on Route 30 in the towns of Roxbury and Middletown and the village of Margaretville; and on Route 28 in the town of Hurley.
