We all think we can "take the heat", but in reality we all walk around dehydrated already, and tend to ignore symptoms of these ailments even when they are present. Please refer to the below signs and symptoms, exercise caution in the heat, and drink plenty of water!!!! As always, call 91 1 in an emergency! Heat Stroke (A DIRE MEDICAL EMERGENCY):

- Body temperature over 105 degrees
- Throbbing headache
- Dizziness and light-headedness
- Lack ofsweating despite the heat
- Red, hot, and dry skin Muscle weakness or cramps
- Nausea and vomiting
- Rapid heartbeat, which may be either strong or weak
- Rapid, shallow breathing
- Behavioral changes such as confusion, disorientation, or staggering
- Seizures. Unconsciousness

Heat Exhaustion:

- Pale skin
- Muscle or abdominal cramps
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Dizziness, Headache, Fatigue
- Profuse sweating
- Rapid heartbeat
- Confusion or Fainting

The Monthly Report for The Shandaken Historical Museum for June 2025

On Saturday June 5th, the Shandaken Historical Museum paid tribute to its founder Nancy Smith by dedicating the Pine Hill bridge near Main and Academy Street "The Nancy T. Smith Memorial Bridge." A heartfelt dedication and celebration were given at the Museum for Nancy Smith's friends, fans and family. The Museum felt that the bridge will serve as a symbol that connects Pine Hill's past with its future. On Sunday, June 15th noted author Evan Pritchard gave a multimedia presentation called "Turtle Tracks". Over a dozen people came-most were Evan's fans but some people were locals who had never been to the Museum. The presentation was rich and rewarding with a flute intro followed by an intriguing walking tour of the original Algonquin Turtle Island Trail that became Route 22. The story shed a new light on early New York City history and put the layout of Manhattan streets in a whole new light. The audience loved the presentation. Evan will present Part 2 the Turtle Tracks presentation in August.

The Museum is planning for our upcoming metal detecting weekend of August 9th and 10th. We are working with the Nor'easters Metal Detecting Club from Stamford CT. This metal detecting opportunity is available free for local property owners to find and unearth potentially rare or historically important metal treasures. The Nor'easters have worked with and helped sponsor the Museum for almost a decade. We look forward to literally digging into the history of Shandaken at many local sites.

Gisi Vella of the Morton Memorial Library reconnected former Chichester postmaster and local historian, Charlie Zimmerman with the Shandaken Historical Museum last week. We are planning to revive, update and improve a series of multimedia presentations that he started 20 years ago about the history of Shandaken and its twelve hamlets. The first presentation about the history of Chichester will be in the fall.

There will be a series of live concerts featuring live music from bands like Lex Grey and the Urban Pioneers, The Trapp, Wyld Blu, Thunder Ridge, and the 209s. All at Big Indian Park on July 13 and 27th, August 10th and 24th and September 7th. Come out for great fun, handcrafted local cider, brews, wine, and a great food truck. It's family and dog friendly! No Cover!

In June the museum had some 30 visitors. Many leaving generous contributions and messages of thanks and appreciation.

CONTRACT FOR EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERVICE

THIS AGREEMENT, made the 1st day of January, in the year 2025, between the Town Board of the Town of Lexington, Greene County, State of New York with a mailing address of 3542 Route 42, PO Box 28, Lexington, NY 12452, party of the first part, and the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken, Ulster County, State of New York with a mailing address of 7209 NY-28, Shandaken, NY 12480, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town of Lexington is desirous of entering into an agreement for providing emergency ambulance service to a portion the Town of Lexington pursuant to the provisions of General Municipal Law Section 122b; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken is desirous of furnishing emergency ambulance service to the Town of Lexington under the terms and conditions set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Town Boards of the Towns of Lexington and Shandaken, respectively, each of the Towns duly authorized this contract with each other for emergency ambulance service to the Town of Lexington (CON # 6251) upon the terms and provisions herein set forth; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the Town of Lexington does engage the Town of Shandaken to furnish emergency ambulance service to the Town of Lexington, and the Town of Shandaken agrees to furnish such protection, commencing January 1, 2025 in the following manner, to wit;

ARTICLE 1. SERVICE TO BE PROVIDED

A. The Town of Shandaken agrees to furnish 24-hour emergency ambulance service in the Town of Lexington, and when notified by telephone or in any other manner of the need for this service within the Town of Lexington, the Town of Shandaken Ambulance will respond and attend, when available, upon the emergency without delay to transport any sick or injured person within the Town of Lexington of Broad Street Hollow, Timberlake Road, Peck Hollow and Regina's Way, to the most appropriate emergency care facility.

- B. The Town of Shandaken further agrees to incur and pay for the following operating expenses from the consideration paid by the Town of Lexington under this agreement:
 - (i) Replacement of medical supplies and equipment;
 - (ii) All insurances set forth below in Article 5; and
- (iii) All liability, contractual liability, malpractice, workers' compensation, contractual and/or errors and omissions insurance covering all members of the Town of Shandaken Ambulance.
- C. Shandaken shall add signage/stickers to each ambulance vehicle on the front, back and both sides reading "Serving the Town of Lexington". The Lexington Ambulance District shall pay all costs associated with such signage/stickers.

ARTICLE 2. TERM

The term of this agreement shall continue until either party, upon thirty (30) days' written notice, terminate this contract.

ARTICLE 3. CONSIDERATION

In consideration of the furnishing of emergency protection, the Town of Lexington shall pay to the Town of Shandaken the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) annually. The Town of Shandaken shall submit to the Town of Lexington Ambulance District a report of its ambulance calls on a semi-annual basis. With consideration to the future, this payment may be amended.

ARTICLE 4. DONATIONS

The Town of Shandaken is permitted and encouraged to accept donations and to conduct fund-raising affairs for the Town of Shandaken Ambulance.

ARTICLE 5. INSURANCE

The Town of Shandaken shall furnish the Town of Lexington with satisfactory proof of coverage of all insurance coverages required pursuant to the Town of Shandaken Ambulance upon demand by the Town of Lexington.

ARTICLE 6. RIGHT TO STOP WORK OR TERMINATE CONTRACT

If either party fails or refuses to comply with all applicable laws or ordinances, or otherwise is guilty o a substantial violation of any provision of this contract, either party may, upon thirty (30 days' notice, specifying with particularity the basis therefore, have the right to stop work or terminate this contract.

ARTICLE 7. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

It is hereby mutually covenanted and agreed that the relation of the Town of Shandaken to the work to be performed by it under this contract shall be that of an independent contractor.

ARTICLE 8. INDEMNITY AND SAVE HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The Town of Shandaken agrees to indemnify and save the Town of Lexington, its officers, agents and employees harmless from any liability imposed upon the Town of Lexington, its officers, agents and/or employees arising from the negligence, active or passive, of the Town of Shandaken.

ARTICLE 9. NO ASSIGNMENT

In accordance with the provisions of Section 109 of the General Municipal aw, the Town of Shandaken is hereby prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting or otherwise disposing of this agreement, or of its right, title or interest in this agreement, or its power to execute this agreement, to any other person or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the Town of Lexington except those items allowable under the provisions and operation of mutual aid.

ARTICLE 10. AUTHORITY ON BEHALF OF THE TOWNS

Each Supervisor has executed this agreement pursuant to a Resolution adopted by the respective Town Boards for the Towns of Lexington and Shandaken. The respective Supervisors, whose signatures appear hereafter, are duly authorized and empowered to execute this instrument and enter into such an agreement on behalf of the respective Towns. This instrument shall be executed in duplicate. At least one copy shall be permanently filed, after execution thereof, in the offices of the respective Town Clerks.

ARTICLE 11. NOTICES

No waiver of any breach of any condition of the agreement shall be binding unless stated in writing and signed by

the party waiving said breach, No such waiver shall in any way affect any other breach unless the waiver shall include the same

ARTICLE 13. MODIFICATION

This agreement constitutes the complete understanding of the parties. No modification of any provisions thereof shall be valid unless stated in writing and signed by both parties.
